# INTRODUCTION

The Illinois State Board of Elections is pleased to present its latest report summarizing the flow of dollars in political campaigns in Illinois during the 2014 election cycle. Again we have attempted to paint the "big picture" in an effort to bring some meaningful analysis to the large sums of money spent to elect candidates to public office in this state.

The races covered in this review include contests for judicial offices, statewide offices, and the Illinois General Assembly. The information is based on public reports filed with the Board by these committees as required by law. All information in this report is publicly available.

The Board appreciated the positive response and helpful suggestions subsequent to the publication of its previous reports. We hope this latest publication will enhance the current debate on how to regulate money in political campaigns for public office.

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# GLOSSARY OF TERMS

***Candidate Political Committee*** - The candidate himself or herself or any natural person, trust, partnership, corporation, or other organization or group of persons designated by the candidate that accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$5,000 on behalf of the candidate.

***Political Party Committee*** - The State central committee of a political party, a county central committee of a political party, a legislative caucus committee, or a committee formed by a ward or township committeeman of a political party. For purposes of this Article, a “legislative caucus committee” means a committee established for the purpose of electing candidates to the General Assembly by the person elected President of the Senate, Minority Leader of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, or a committee established by 5 or more members of the same caucus of the Senate or 10 or more members of the same caucus of the House of Representatives.

***Political Action Committee*** - Any natural person, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or other organization or group of persons, other than a candidate, political party, candidate political committee, or political party committee, that accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$5,000 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for public office. “Political action committee” includes any natural person, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or other organization or group of persons, other than a candidate, political party, candidate political committee, or political party committee, that makes electioneering communications during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$5,000 related to any candidate or candidates for public office.

***Ballot Initiative Committee*** - Any natural person, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or other organization or group of persons that accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$5,000 in support of in or in opposition to any question of public policy to be submitted to the electors. “Ballot initiative committee” includes any natural person, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or other organization or group of persons that makes electioneering communications during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$5,000 related to any question of public policy to be submitted to the voters. The \$5,000 threshold applies to any contributions or expenditures received or made with the purpose of securing a place on the ballot for, advocating the defeat or passage of, or engaging in electioneering communication regarding the question of public policy, regardless of the method of initiation of the question of public policy and regardless of whether petitions have been circulated or filed with the appropriate office or whether the question has been adopted and certified by the governing body.

***Independent Expenditure Committee*** - Any trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or other organization or group of persons formed for the exclusive purpose of making independent

expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$5,000 in support of or in opposition to (i) the nomination for election, election, retention, or defeat of any public official or candidate or (ii) any question of public policy to be submitted to the electors. "Independent expenditure committee" also includes any trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or other organization or group of persons that makes electioneering communications that are not made in connection, consultation, or concert with or at the request or suggestion of a public official or candidate, a public official's or candidate's designated political committee or campaign, or an agent or agents of the public official, candidate, or political committee or campaign during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 related to (i) the nomination for election, election, retention, or defeat of any public official or candidate or (ii) any question of public policy to be submitted to the voters.

***Candidate*** - Any person who seeks nomination for election, election to or retention in public office, or any person who seeks election as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population, whether or not such person is elected. A person seeks nomination for election, election or retention if he (1) takes the action necessary under the laws of this State to attempt to qualify for nomination for election, election to or retention in public office, or election as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population, or (2) receives contributions or makes expenditures, or gives consent for any other person to receive contributions or make expenditures with a view to bringing about his nomination for election to or retention in public office, or his or her election as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population.

***Contribution*** - A gift, subscription, donation, dues, loans, advance, or deposit of money or anything of value, knowingly received in connection with the nomination for election, or election, of any person to public office, in connection with the election of any person as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population, or in connection with a question of public policy.

***Independent Expenditure*** - Any payment, gift, donation, or expenditure of funds (i) by a natural person or political committee for the purpose of making electioneering communications or of expressly advocating for or against the nomination for election, retention, or defeat of a clearly identifiable public official or candidate or for or against any question of public policy to be submitted to the voters and (ii) that is not made in connection, consultation, or concert with or at the request or suggestion of the public official or candidate, the public official's or candidate's designated political committee or campaign, or the agent or agents of the public official, candidate, or political committee or campaign.

***In-Kind Contribution*** – A receipt of goods or services in lieu of a monetary contribution.

***Expenditure*** - A payment, distribution, purchase, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or anything of value, in connection with the nomination for election, or election, of any person to public office, in connection with the election of any person as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population, or in connection with any question of public policy.

***Transfer of Funds*** - Any conveyance of money or the purchase of tickets made in connection with the

nomination for election, election or retention of any person to or in public office or in connection with any question of public policy from one political committee to another political committee.

**GP** - The General Primary Election, which was March 18, 2014. The Quarterly Reports covering the period January 1, 2014, through June 30, 2014, were used to compile data for the General Primary.

**GE** – The General Election, which was November 4, 2014. The Quarterly Reports covering the period July 1, 2014, through December 31, 2014, were used to compile data for the General Election.

**The following pages represent aggregate totals showing money available and expended for Democratic, Republican, Miscellaneous, and Independent Expenditure committees. These terms are defined as follows:**

***Available*** - The sum of beginning funds available and total receipts for the reporting period, thus representing the total amount of money a political committee had at its disposal.

***Expended*** - The total amount spent by a political committee during the reporting period.

***Democrat*** – A political committee which has indicated on its statement of organization an affiliation with the Democratic Party. (1440 political committees-GP, 1386 political committees-GE)



***Republican*** – A political committee which has indicated on its statement of organization an affiliation with the Republican Party. (1163 political committees-GP, 1177 political committees-GE)

***Miscellaneous*** – A political committee which has indicated no direct affiliation with the Democratic or Republican Party. (1347 political committees-GP, 1355 political committees-GE)

***Independent Expenditure*** – A political committee which has indicated an intent to exclusively make independent expenditures (1 political committee –GP, 10 political committees-GE)



# MONEY AVAILABLE & EXPENDED

**The following pages include charts and tables which represent aggregate totals for legislative committees, judicial committees, political action committees (PACs), ballot initiative committees and independent expenditure committees. These terms are defined as follows:**

***Legislative Committees*** - Political committees which have indicated on their statements of organization that the purpose of the committee is to support or oppose a candidate's nomination, election or re-election to the House or Senate. (217 GP Committees, 220 GE Committees)

***Judicial Committees*** - Political committees which have indicated on their statements of organization that the purpose of the committee is to support or oppose a candidate's nomination, election or retention to judicial office. (124 GP Committees, 114 GE Committees)

***PACs*** - Political committees which have indicated on their statements of organization no direct affiliation to a candidate or party. (1,015 GP Committees, 989 GE Committees)

***Ballot Initiative Committees*** - Political committees which have indicated on their Statements of Organization support of or opposition to questions of public policy to be submitted to the electors. (70 GP Committees, 82 GE Committees)

***Independent Expenditure Committees*** - Political committees which have indicated on their Statements of Organization that their exclusive purpose is to make independent expenditures. (30 GP Committees, 34 GE Committees)

# RECEIPTS, IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS & INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURES

The receipt and in-kind contributions graphs illustrate in-kind contributions received by House and Senate candidates. In-kind contributions are receipts of goods and services as opposed to hard dollars.

The expenditure and transfers out graphs illustrate the monetary donations made by House and Senate candidates as opposed to the regular expenditures of the committees.

The purpose of comparing in-kind contributions to transfers out (monetary donations) is to explore the difference between the two, based upon who decides how such contributions shall be used. Monetary donations can be used as the candidates deem necessary, but decisions regarding in-kind contributions (e.g. printing, radio or TV spots) are made by the committees making the donations in conjunction with the candidates receiving the in-kind contributions.


These totals do not include those from candidate committees not identified as either Democratic or Republican.

Independent expenditures are payments, gifts, donations, or expenditures of funds expressly advocating the nomination, election, retention, or defeat of candidates for public office or questions of public policy that are not made in connection, consultation, or concert with the associated candidate or ballot initiative committees. The independent expenditure graph here does not include such expenditures made by specifically established independent expenditure committees.

Independent expenditures from committees that have not identified themselves as Independent Expenditure Committees on their D-1 Statements of Organization are not made in support of the committees' candidates of record.

## 2014 General Primary Election







## Average Individual Contribution Received General Election




# Average PAC Contribution Received General Election





# ELECTRONIC FILING

Political committees that, during a reporting period, reach or exceed \$10,000 in their balances, accumulation of contributions, or aggregate expenditures are required under the Illinois Campaign Finance Act to file disclosure reports electronically.

The State Board of Elections provides such committees with a web-based electronic filing system at no charge. All reports filed electronically are promptly made available to the public by means of a searchable database on the Board's website, [www.elections.il.gov](http://www.elections.il.gov).

The graph on the next page shows the percentage of Legislative and Judicial Committees, as well as Political Action Committees that filed their 2014 disclosure reports electronically. It also shows the percentage of A-1 reports (receipts of \$1,000 from single sources.) that were filed electronically in 2014. The A-1 data references all political committees.

A-1 reports must be filed within five business days of receipt (within two business days, for receipts of \$1000 or more within 30 days of an election). The table on the next page shows the number of A-1 reports filed per month and the aggregate amount of reported receipts in those filings.





**The following pages portray aggregate campaign finance data for all General Assembly races on the 2014 Illinois ballot. Several explanations are needed before reviewing the data.**

In-kind contributions have been added to expenditures to derive a more accurate expenditure per vote. An in-kind represents an expenditure made by another on behalf of the candidate.

Representative District 22 has expenditures reduced by the amounts donated to or spent on the behalf of other candidates. The adjustment was made to reflect the leadership position of the candidate in the above district and more accurately reflect expenditures per vote in this district.

Candidates with no political committees on file are not included. These candidates collected/expended no more than \$5,000 in a 12 month period, which is the statutory threshold for reporting in Illinois.

Candidates with political committees that did not file their Quarterly reports for either the first six months or last six months of 2014 by March 31, 2015, are also excluded from the corresponding tables.
