The regular monthly meeting of the State Board of Elections was called to order at 10:50 a.m. with five members present. Chairman Porter, Vice Chairman Schneider and Member Brady were delayed. Member McGuffage was present in the Chicago office and connected via videoconference.

Member Keith, serving as temporary Chairman until Chairman Porter arrived, opened the meeting by leading everyone in the pledge of allegiance.

Member Keith presented the minutes of the November 19 and December 6 regular monthly Board meetings, and the December 21 and December 28 special meetings. Member Keith noted that revised minutes were distributed to Board members. Member Walters questioned his attendance in one set of minutes and staff will review this. Member Smart moved to approve the minutes as amended. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 6-0 with Member Smart voting Vice Chairman Schneider's proxy.

Member Keith noted the need to convene as the State Officers Electoral Board to approve minutes from the November 19, December 6 and December 21 Electoral Board meetings. Member Rednour moved to recess as the State Board of Elections and convene as the State Officers Electoral Board. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously. Meeting recessed at 10:55 a.m. and reconvened at 10:56 a.m. Chairman Porter arrived at this time.

The Executive Director indicated that Lance Gough, Executive Director of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners, was present to request approval of a modification to their voting system. Dianne Felts indicated there was insufficient time for staff to test the modification and indicated that Mr. Gough believes that their testing of the change was thorough. Mr. Gough indicated the test consisted of 2000 transmissions and tested 100% accurate. Mark McKinney, representative from Sequoia, spoke of the need for the modification and indicated it only affects the reconciliation between the two systems, Edge II and Insight. Member Smart moved that with confidence in Mr. Gough's statement and with staff's approval to allow the Chicago Board to proceed with the modification of the HAAT for the February 5, 2008 primary election. Mrs. Felts indicated there was no choice at this time but to rely on Mr. Gough's confidence that the system will work properly. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0. Member Brady and Vice Chairman Schneider arrived at 11:10 a.m.

Director White discussed the preparations for the February 5 primary election day. There will be a limited number of staff in the field for the primary and staff will also be present in the 14th Congressional District for the special election also to be held on February 5. Pre-election day meetings would take place later this week. This year's public information program was the farthest reaching awareness program to date. There has been an increase in early voting numbers and today is the last day for grace period registration. A listing of the election judge's schools was also included in the packet. Director White presented an Election Day Contingency plan which was also discussed at the Advisory Committee meeting held earlier this morning. Other states were surveyed and a brief contingency plan was prepared although there is no authority in Illinois to cancel an election. Member Smart moved to approve the Election Day Contingency Plan. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0 with Member Smart voting Member Walter's proxy as he had stepped out of the room. Director White indicated he would distribute to all election authorities.

Director White reported on the Advisory Committee meeting held just prior to the start of the Board meeting this morning. It was a small group but there was good discussion on legislative

activity, pre-primary election plans, statewide database and the Election Day Contingency Plan. The next Advisory Committee meeting is scheduled for May 19, 2008.

Cris Cray discussed the 2008 legislative program which was included in the Board packet. She indicated that this session is deemed an "emergency" year and was not sure how many bills will be let out. Ms. Cray discussed the proposals and noted that a number of the proposals in the packet can actually be combined. Chairman Porter felt that the letter the General Counsel sent to the legislative leadership addressing the gap that exists in 7-10 regarding signature requirements for nominating petitions of established political party candidates seeking the office of Representative in Congress should be submitted as well. The letter advised them of the situation with the Green Party and the fact that staff applied the default number of 600 signatures because the applicable provisions of Section 7-10 did not apply to the Green Party. The letter also indicated the Board has taken no position on how any amendment should be drafted but wanted to bring to the leaders attention and request an appropriate amendment to the statute that would clear up the ambiguity. This will be added to the proposals as item 16. Discussion ensued on item 3 which would allow federal committees to access the pre-ballot request website. Current law allows state and local committees access but it appears there was an oversight and federal committees were left out. Member Brady suggested wording it "committee's registered under federal law". Discussion returned to item 16 and the General Counsel noted that it was not a recurring problem as this was the first time he has seen it happen and noted that the party did not seek judicial review. Member Smart moved to approve the legislative proposals including item 16. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Executive Director presented a proposal to reduce the price charged to registered political committees for the voter registration data. This is a benefit of the statewide system and the SBE will not longer need to reimburse jurisdictions for payment to their vendors for creating a file in our suggested format. The new system does the translation and goes into their database and pulls the data out. Member Keith asked how the new prices were determined. Kyle Thomas noted that other

states were surveyed and Mike Roate noted that it would be hard to actually do a cost accounting analysis on such a program. The money received from the voter registration data goes into the General Revenue Fund, not the State Board of Elections budget. Member Smart moved to approve the price schedule as presented and monitor the situation and if it does not appear to be working to return to the Board. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

Director White presented for Board consideration the FY 09 appropriation request indicating it is a sizeable request over last year's budget. However, the request will provide funding necessary to move forward with major mandated federal and state initiatives such as the Statewide Voter Registration System, the Voting Systems Testing Center, electronic canvassing of statewide vote totals and website enhancements to the Voter's Guide and IDIS. The request also includes the additional funding for the increased pay for election judges, four additional staff members, telecommunications upgrades, authority to spend the HAVA funds, and one time funds to host COGEL. In response to a question it was indicated that election judge reimbursements are for the actual number of judges used in a particular election. Discussion ensued on the county clerk stipends and the fact that it is a mandate and in our budget. Member McGuffage felt it should be included is another agency's budget. Staff indicated they would check to see what the law actually requires. Member Smart moved to approve the budget request as presented that will include any action taken in Executive Session the affects the budget. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Executive Director presented the FY 08 fiscal status report for the period ending December 31, the FY 08 fiscal report for the Help Illinois Vote Fund, and the two year plan of activity for the months of January and February.

The General Counsel presented two matters for consideration of civil penalty assessments for failure to comply with a Board order. Mr. Sandvoss reviewed the activities of both committees in the matters of *SBE v. Friends of Don Patterson*, and *SBE v. Citizens for Hawkins*. He concurred with the hearing officer's recommendation that the Board assess civil penalties not to exceed \$5,000. No one

was present for either of the committees. Discussion ensued on the probability of ever receiving anything from these committees as neither have appeared at any proceeding to explain why they have failed to file the appropriate report. Member Smart moved to approve the recommendation of the hearing officer and General Counsel. Vice Chairman Schneider seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0. Vice Chairman Schneider voted Member Brady's proxy as he had stepped out of the room.

The General Counsel presented two motions for reconsideration. The first matter, *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Edward Chaney*, has no supporting documentation for reconsideration and no one was present. In the matter of *SBE v. Kankakee Federation of Labor*, Dan Baisden was present. Mr. Sandvoss recommended both motions for reconsideration be denied. Mr. Baisden indicated this committee was small and in May of last year he was diagnosed with throat cancer and was undergoing chemotherapy. No one else had access to the information. They now have a second person who has access to the computer. Mr. Sandvoss indicated if the Board grants the motion for reconsideration it vacates the Board order and allows the matter to go to a hearing. Vice Chairman Schneider moved that based on circumstances presented today to grant the motion for reconsideration in the matter of *SBE v. Kankakee Federation of Labor* and refer to a hearing officer. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

Member Smart then moved to deny the motion for reconsideration in the matter of *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Edward Chaney*. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel then presented two carryovers from the November meeting which were appeals of campaign disclosure fines which the hearing officer recommended be denied. Mr. Sandvoss indicated in the matter of *SBE v. Friends of Judy Stearns*, they have asked that this be placed on the February meeting agenda. Member Smart moved to continue the matter *SBE v. Friends of Judy Stearns* to the February meeting. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 7-1 with Member Walters voting in the negative.

The General Counsel indicated he concurred with the hearing officer's recommendation that the appeal be denied in the matter of *SBE v. Committee to Elect Edward "Ed" Russell*. Angela Perry, Treasurer of the committee, and Ed Russell were present in this matter. Ms. Perry indicated an honest mistake was made and the report contained the date the three checks were written rather than received. Mr. Sandvoss indicated the checks were received at a fundraiser and an A-1 was required to be submitted within 2 business days. The penalty was reduced in this case. Discussion ensued on the reports that were filed and Mr. Sandvoss revised his recommendation to change the recommendation on the A-1 because that they were timely reported although on a wrong form and the appeal be granted in this case. The only penalty due and owing would be for \$1,000. Member Keith moved to grant the appeal of the civil penalty of \$3,000 leaving a balance of \$1,000 due and owing. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented appeals of civil penalties which the hearing officer has recommended be granted and he concurred with the recommendations. Member Smart moved to grant the appeals in the matters of *SBE v. Democratic Citizens Assoc. of Caseyville Twp.*, *SBE v. St. Clair County Democratic Central Committee.*, *SBE v. North Central IL Laborers Council PAC*, *SBE v. IL Committee for Honest Government.*; *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Mark Riefenberg*, *SBE v. Basic Crafts Council of Mid-Central Illinois*, *SBE v. Friends for Michelle Chavez*. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented appeals of civil penalties that the hearing officer recommended be denied. Dave Chapman was present in the matter of *SBE v. Citizens for John Cullerton* and did not dispute the fine. He indicated they inadvertently checked the nonparticipating committee box and as a result failed to file an A-1 and were assessed a penalty. He requested leniency in the assessment of the penalty because they did in fact file a report. Mr. Sandvoss indicated it was a valid assessment because nothing was reported on the nonparticipation report and believed this assessment for failing to file a pre-election report is valid and concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer. Member Smart moved to deny the appeal. Member Walters

seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Board recessed at 1 p.m. and reconvened at 1:10 p.m.

The General Counsel reported back to the Board on the matter of the county clerk stipends. There is a provision in the county's Code, 55 ILCS 5/4-6001 which requires the county clerk stipend to be appropriated by the General Assembly to the State Board of Elections which then turns around and distributes the awards in annual lump sum payments to the clerks.

The General Counsel returned to the appeals of fines which the hearing officer recommended be denied and he concurred in all recommendations. No one was present in any of the cases. Member Keith moved to adopt the recommendation of the hearing officer and General Counsel and deny the appeals in the matters of *SBE v. Pulaski County Democratic Central Committee*, *SBE v. Vision for the Future*, *SBE v. Moraine 2001*, *SBE v. Citizens for Reilly*, *SBE v. Friends of Randy Lewis*, *SBE v. Citizens for Jamal Barnes*, *SBE v. AFSCME IL Council 31 PAC*, *SBE v. Good Government Council*, *SBE v. Operating Engineers Local 965 Political Education Committee*, *SBE v. Chicago Latino 100*, *SBE v. Sherrill for State Senate*, *SBE v. Restore Illinois Now*. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented a listing of committees who received assessment letters and did not appeal the penalty and asked the Board to approve final orders. Member Keith moved to enter Board orders on committees listed on Mr. Borgsmiller's letter of January 22, 2008. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0 with Member Brady abstaining from the Citizens for Stephanie Neely committee. Member Walters questioned who was the Sportsman's Committee on Political Education. Mr. Sandvoss indicated he would look into this.

The General Counsel presented for informational purposes a listing of committees who have paid civil penalties for the period November 29, 2007 through January 9, 2008.

The General Counsel presented complaints following public hearings. In the matter of *SBE v. Citizens for Jim Rowe*, the hearing officer recommends no further action be taken as the committee has filed the reports at issue, however staff will assess an appropriate civil penalty for late filing. In

the matter of *SBE v. Vision 81*, the hearing officer found that the complaint was filing on justifiable grounds but the committee has filed the reports and paid the penalties assessed and the recommendation was that no further action be taken. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to adopt the recommendation of the hearing officer. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented complaints following closed preliminary hearings which will be heard in closed session. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to recess to executive session for consideration of campaign disclosure matters, pending litigation and personnel matters. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed unanimously. Meeting recessed at 1:25 and reconvened at 3:05 p.m.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer and general counsel in the matter of *Coats v. Citizens for Hutchinson*, to find the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds however all necessary amendments to complaints having been made that no public hearing is required and the matter is disposed of. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved in the matters of *SBE v. The Illinois Business PAC*, *SBE v. Citizens for a Better 24th Ward*, *SBE v. Michael Bowens for 4th Ward Alderman*, *SBE v. Sportsman's Committee on Political Education (SCOPE)*, *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Anthony McCaskill*, *SBE v. Citizens for Honest Government*, *SBE v. Committee to Elect Michael Baxton*, *SBE v. East St. Louis City Democratic Club*, *SBE v. 16th Ward Regular Democratic Organization*, *SBE v. Friends of Robert A. Ingrassia*, *SBE v. Citizens for Bilotta*, *SBE v. Maywood United Party*, *SBE v. 1st Ward Republican Organization*, *SBE v. Salamanca for Change*, *SBE v. Friends of Don Patterson*, 07CD101; *SBE v. Friends of Julius Anderson*, *SBE v. Citizens for Juanaid M. Afeef*, *SBE v. Friends of Hawthorne*, and *SBE v. Committee to Elect Keith Lawler*. No one was present in these matters. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved in the matters of *SBE v. Niles Township Regular Republican*

Organization, SBE v. Horsepower PAC LTD dba Thoroughbred Industry, to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer with the amendment there be no additional order to file electronically. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved to direct the Executive Director to implement one time salary adjustments as discussed in executive session. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

In regard to "other business" Vice Chairman Schneider indicated he had nothing to discuss on the Jeffrey Hurst nominating petitions matter.

The next meeting of the State Board of Elections will be Wednesday, February 13, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. to canvass the special election.

The next regular meeting of the State Board of Elections will be held on Tuesday, February 19, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. in Chicago.

With there being no further discussion, Vice Chairman Schneider moved to adjourn until February 13 or the call of the chair. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 3:10 p.m.

We have concluded the earliest primary election in Illinois history. By most accounts it was one of the most successful as well. Early unofficial reports indicate that we had a record number of voters for a presidential primary election. Approximately 3 million votes were cast. The previous record was 2,561,882 in 1992. In 2004, just over 2 million votes were cast, thus a 50% increase from the last presidential primary election.

As a percentage of registered voters, the preliminary estimate of 3 million voters would translate to a turnout of 41.6 percent. In 1992 the turnout percentage was a record 44%.

We conducted an extensive state public information campaign informing Illinois voters of the early primary date, early voting and grace period registration.

Early voting also set records for participation. A preliminary total (some jurisdictions have not yet reported) indicates that over 260,000 voters took advantage of early voting, far surpassing the 2006 General Election record of 170,568. When all early voting results are tallied, we estimate that approximately 300,000 state voters cast ballots early.

On Election Day there were reports of normal election problems such as: wrong ballot styles given out, electioneering, a few late opening polls, some equipment malfunctions, and even some precincts running out of ballots, but for the most part, voting throughout the state went smoothly overall. As usual, most calls received Election Day were routine in nature, centering on individuals' registration status or polling place location. Fewer calls were received than anticipated concerning polling places opening late and tabulating equipment failures.

The problem of erroneously issued ballots (including "federal offices only" ballots) appeared to be widespread throughout the state. This has occurred in past elections, but some jurisdictions had troublingly large numbers of such ballot errors. Several election authorities called to report this not only on Election Day but during the next couple of days following the election as they discovered the problem.

Some precincts issued "federal offices only" ballots to all voters during the entire day or until just shortly before the polls closed. In one jurisdiction, the outcome of a race for state's attorney may possibly be affected as several federal ballots were issued with only 19 votes separating the two Republican candidates at the time I was notified Wednesday morning. A judicial candidate voted a "federal offices only" ballot and called afterwards complaining of not being able to vote for himself. In several instances, election judges themselves voted the "federal offices only" ballot.

Several staff was assigned to jurisdiction to observe Election Day procedures at the polls and at the central counting stations.

Rick Fulle was assigned to the 14th Congressional District as a result of the Special Congressional Primary. Throughout the day, few calls were received pertaining to the Special Primary. On a couple of occasions, voters were issued and voted two ballots for the General Primary rather than being issued a separate ballot for the General Primary and a ballot for the Special Congressional Primary.

Bruce Brown and Mickey Reinders visited 32 precincts in Sangamon County and reported on average that only three election judges served in the precincts they visited and in some instances only two. Several of the judges complained they received more complaints about the voting system than during previous elections. According to the staff conducting site visits, some of the confusion was due to the large number of delegates that was on the ballots, more first time voters, and the instructions provided to the voters by election judges were not adequate or in some cases not provided at all. Some equipment issues did occur with the most notable being problems with the voting system's printer.

Bruce and Mickey observed the tabulation of absentee ballots at the counting center and noticed the vendor representative using a scanning tabulator to count the absentee ballots received through the mail. Staff learned that Sangamon County uses a tabulator not approved by the SBE

for obtaining unofficial results for mailed-in absentees and then counts them by hand for the official count.

Eric Donnewald continues to report that ballots containing write-ins are being counted at the central counting station in East St. Louis rather than at the precinct polling places as required per 24B-10.1 of the Election Code.

Jeff Berry indicated the County Clerk, Nancy Kline has made significant process in Alexander County concerning election administration. A master file has now been created with considerable progress being made with the automation of the registration process. Several new election judges were appointed and trained which appeared to improve upon procedures at the polling places. The county clerk has indicated that a purge of the voter rolls will occur before the November General Election, something which has not occurred in that county for years.

Ken Menzel was in McHenry County on Election Day and was very complimentary of the County Clerk, Katherine "Kathie" Schultz and her staff in how they administer all aspects of the election process.

Brent Davis was at the central counting station in St. Clair County and commented how well organized and smooth the process went there.

VOSS pre-tested three jurisdictions for the February 5, 2008 General Primary. The following includes our findings.

Greene County GBS Accu-Vote & TSX

The test consisted of 3,601 ballots. Staff tested all 24 precincts on both machines. Staff discovered that many of the touch screen machines needed to be recalibrated. One of them actually froze up and it needed to be rebooted and recalibrated. Staff showed the vendor representative the problem to correct. As for the optical scan tabulators, we discovered a program error with all 10 precincts which were in the 19th Congressional District. Apparently, the election authority needed a change on one of the ballot styles to add a write-in line to a precinct committeeman's race and since the election management program automatically configures the ovals and offices, this changed the positioning of the candidates. For example, the presidential candidate Mitt Romney was first on the ballot and he received "0" votes even though staff had ballots with votes for him. The vendor representative called his office. They corrected the mistake and modemed him the correction. He burned the new cards and we began again to tabulate the 10 precincts with the 19th congressional. On the last precinct, the precinct that actually had caused the change with the additional write-in line, we discovered that the error was still occurring. This time some of the ballots were not being accepted by the machine and the LCD was saying an over-vote for an office which was not over-voted on that ballot. The tape once again showed "0" for some candidates. Once again the vendor rep received a new program. He changed the card and we reran the precinct with no errors. We checked the touch screen machines and they did not have this problem in the 19th. After this, we still had problems in that the memory

card would not upload for two precincts. The one precinct also had to be especially reconfigured because it too had a write-in line added after the initial program was compiled. We had to remark ballots in this precinct and scan the newly marked ones. The vendor representative was able to upload both precincts the second time so that we could get a summary and canvass of all the precincts. We also found a misspelling of a name for a precinct committeeman's office on the tabulator's tape along with two ballot set-up errors prior to the pre-test. These were all the problems that we encountered.

Menard County ES&S M-100 & Auto-MARK

The test consisted of 2,952 ballots. Staff tested all 16 precincts on both machines. While testing the Auto-MARKs, we had at least 5 machines malfunction. One machine we had trouble getting the program card into the slot and then when we did succeed, it would not work properly. Two machines had belt problems in which one was eating the ballots and two machines had calibration problems. We also had some unusual messages from the machines in that one machine gave an over-vote message when there wasn't one for that office but it only did it once and this happening we could not replicate. Another occurrence had the candidate's name highlighted when touched but the machine did not darken the oval in order to give the candidate a vote. This too could not be replicated and only happened once. All Auto-MARK machines had been serviced prior to our arrival. But the clerk did tell us that since HAVA, he had only one person vote on them. We discovered no errors on the scan tabulators.

Shelby County GBS/Liberty Accu-Vote & TSX

The test consisted of 5,168 ballots. Staff tested all 33 precincts on both machines. We had one touch screen freeze-up but after re-calibration it worked fine. We discovered no errors on the scan tabulators.

Last fall, the Governor signed Public Act 95-441 which established the Election Day Voter Registration Commission, consisting of four members of the General Assembly and four public members.

The members are: state representatives Tim Schmitz and Elaine Nekritz; state senators Dale Risinger and Terry Link; and public members Nancy Voots, Will County Clerk; Tom LaCaze, Clinton County Clerk; James Ascot of Chicago; and Mary Ellen Vanderverter of Waukegan.

The legislation provides that the Commission shall study and report to the State Board of Elections (SBE) and the General Assembly on the possible implementation of election day voter registration. The SBE shall provide the Commission with staff and technical assistance. The Commission's work must be completed by January 1, 2009.

Accordingly, we have scheduled the first meeting of the Commission for Wednesday, February 13, 2008 at 10:00 a.m. in the Springfield office. Board members are welcome to attend.

I will provide an update report at the February 19th meeting.

Included in your Board packet materials but under separate cover, are copies of the state two year compliance audit that ended June 30, 2007. There are three findings, but only two made it to the final written synopsis. All three findings are being addressed.

The first finding, non compliance with the Help America Vote Act provision for a computerized centralized statewide voter registration list, is an ongoing project and we expect to be in full compliance by mid year.

The second finding, non compliance with an Election Code provision to give prior written notice to the central committee chairmen of established political parties of the time and place of the 5% precinct random selection prior to the Consolidated Primary, has been addressed and we have provided the appropriate written notice for the primary election.

The third finding, inaccurate Grant/Contract Analysis Form filing with the Comptroller's office, was a one-time misunderstanding of reporting a Secretary of State's HAVA grant refund and will not be repeated.

The audit is the result of many hours of review by a team of trained specialists. To have only three findings is a remarkable achievement. We are pleased with the results and because of lack of significant findings we will not be required to appear before the Legislative Audit Commission.

Credit is shared by the entire staff that assisted in responding to many questions the auditors asked, but special recognition is due to Administrative Services Director Jim Withers and Chief Fiscal Officer Mike Roate, who oversee our fiscal operations.

I, James Cappleman, of Citizens for Cappleman, request a motion for reconsideration to have an appeal granted for case number 07 AC 053 for the following reasons:

1. I never received any mailed notice of a failure to file two Schedule A-1 reports for Ellen Feinberg. I also was not aware that filing these two A-1 reports for Ellen Feinberg had not occurred.
2. I never filed appeals for this because I remained unaware that filing two A-1 reports for Ellen Feinberg had not occurred.
3. When the Board of Elections sent a letter dated November 2, 2007, which detailed some questions regarding the semi-annual report for Jan-Jun 2007, no questions regarding Ellen Feinberg were in this letter, and we remained unaware that two A1 reports neglected to be filed.
4. After delinquent filing of the June 2007 Semi-annual report (07 JS 076) occurred, safeguards were put in place to not have this happen again. It is why the July - December Semi-Annual Report was completed on time and it is also why when an amended return was indicated, Cindi Anderson contacted Andy Nauman from the BOE's Chicago office on Friday, Jan 18, 2008 so that he could explain how to file the amended return. He also reviewed it with Cindi Anderson once she made the requested modifications.
5. I first learned that there was a problem when I received notice of a fine on the evening of Monday, Jan 28, 2008. The next day, I then spoke with Mr. Rupert Borgsmiller from the BOE Campaign Disclosure Division and learned it was due to a failure to file two A-1 reports for Ellen Feinberg.
6. Immediately after the phone conversation with Mr. Borgsmiller, multiple efforts to confirm if Patricia Sullivan (president of Citizens for Cappleman) received any letters from the BOE occurred and have been unsuccessful during the past 48 hours. In the past, she has always forwarded letters from the BOE in a timely manner, so it is believed she did not receive letters from the BOE as well, but I am aware that final confirmation is needed.

Your reconsideration of this appeal would be deeply appreciated.

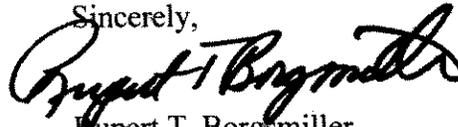

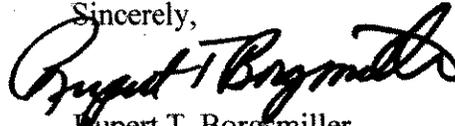

Appeal to Board from Hearing Officer's Recommended Ruling

Now Comes Respondent Judy Stearns, by and through her attorney Richard K. Means and moves that the Hearing Officer's factual findings be accepted but her conclusion that a civil penalty must be assessed and the assessment enforced by immediate collection should be reversed as follows:

1. The amounts assessed are excessive because Respondent's violations were inadvertent, unintentional and, at worst, negligent. Specifically:
 - a. that until after the Hearing Officer's decision, Respondent was a without legal counsel,
 - b. that until after the violations had occurred, Respondent was a without advice from a financial services professional with knowledge of the Campaign Finance Act though she had made efforts to secure such assistance,
 - c. that, prior to the Board's contact with the Respondent on April 9, 2007, Respondent mistakenly believed that the United States Supreme Court ruling in *Buckley v. Valeo* [424 U.S. 1, 96 S. Ct. 612 (1976)] made her exempt from Illinois campaign finance reporting because she did not intend to accept campaign contributions from others in excess of \$3000 but intended her campaign for office to be primarily self-financed. Instead, of course, *Buckley* applies only to candidates for federal office and then only makes them exempt from federal contribution limitations, to the extent that they are self-funded, and does not exempt them from campaign finance reporting,

- d. that, promptly, the day after the Respondent was notified that she was obligated to file a D-1 Statement of Organization, with the assistance of Board Staff, she did so, but she failed to understand and, based on erroneous advice from others, therefore did not comply with her obligations to timely file pre-election reports and A-1 disclosures.
 - e. that, prior to her employment of former Board Staff member Barbara Mason in July of 2007, Respondent mistakenly believed that funds she spent on her own behalf did not need to be reported as contributions or expenditures made on behalf of her candidacy,
 - f. With Ms Mason's assistance, Respondent has filed all disclosures correctly but not timely,
 - g. the Respondent Candidate, herself, did not take contributions (other than from herself) in excess of \$2846.00 or make expenditures (other than from herself) in excess of \$2846.00 during the entire semi-annual period and during her entire successful campaign for the office of Alderman for the City of Bloomington. Thus, her lapse was inadvertent, unintentional and, at worst, negligent as the Hearing Officer concluded,
 - h. that the primary purpose of campaign finance reporting is to inform the electorate of the persons or entities to whom a candidate may be obligated for the funding with which a campaign is financed. It is no revelation or surprise to voters that a candidate supports herself and therefore, the failure of a candidate to disclose her self-funding is not a substantial violation of the Campaign Finance Act though it is a technical violation,
 - i. the D-1 and D-2s show that the Respondent *was in technical violation* of failing to report the formation of a campaign finance committee within 5 business days after the expenditures she made crossed the \$3000 reporting threshold in January of 2007. Likewise her failures to report her contributions to herself on pre-election reports and in A-1 disclosures were technical violations. However no voter was deprived of any knowledge which should have been available to them under the Campaign Finance Act, *other than that the candidate was primarily self-funded*, to better inform their voting because of the Respondent's tardiness in reporting, and
2. Whatever amount the Board chooses to assess should have enforcement and collection stayed pending the Committee's compliance with the Campaign Finance Act for a period of two years because all of the violations upon which assessments were made should be considered collectively as a first offense

pursuant to Section 125.425 (h) of the Board's Rules and Regulations. This case is factually similar to and therefore should be held to the same remedy as this Board applied to the civil penalty assessment appeals in *State Board v. Chicagoland Apartment Association PAC*, 06 MA 001 and *State Board v. Black Legislative Lobby*, 06 MA 002, both of which were decided by this Board on June 12, 2006.

Wherefore, the Candidate prays that whatever amount the Board chooses to assess should have enforcement and collection stayed pending the Committee's compliance with the Campaign Finance Act for a period of two years.

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment For Delinquently Filing a D-1 Statement of Organization, Pre-Election Reports For the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election and the 2007 Consolidated Election and For Failure To File Schedule A-1 Forms for the 2007 Consolidated Election

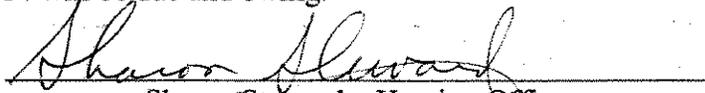
The D-1 Statement of Organization was received on April 10, 2007, 56 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$1400. The Pre-Election Report for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election was received April 26, 2007, 9 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$500. The Pre-Election Report for the 2007 Consolidated Election was received July 20, 2007, 11 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$2200. The Committee received five contributions of more than \$500, all from the candidate, prior to the 2007 Consolidated Election, but failed to list them on a Schedule A-1; the total Schedule A-1 civil penalty is \$2143.90. The total outstanding assessment is \$6243.90. Civil penalties had also been assessed for \$4629.56 for failing to report contributions on a Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, but because the contributions were from the candidate, the committee was given a one time amnesty for those Schedule A-1 violations for that election.

Judith I. Stearns, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and an Appeal Affidavit. In the Affidavit, Ms. Stearns referenced an attached two page letter. She was under the impression that she was not required to file until she received more than \$3,000 in contributions; she did not realize that spending one's own money counted towards the \$3,000 threshold. In late March she thought she might be approaching the \$3,000 threshold in contributions and, on the advice of her state rep, contacted Cris Cray at the Board. Ms. Cray answered her questions and helped her complete the D-1, but she did not file it at that time. On April 9, 2007, she received a letter from the Board advising her of the need to file a D-1. She did so on April 10, 2007. She contacted a CPA and made several calls to the Board and eventually made contact with Barb Mason in July to help her file her reports. She has less than \$100 in her account and is owed more than \$10,500. She stresses that she received misinformation and was totally inexperienced; those being the reasons for her late filings. Her mistakes were entirely unintentional.

The Hearing was scheduled for October 24, 2007, at 10:00 a.m. in the Springfield office of the State Board of Elections. Judy Sterns appeared on behalf of her Committee. Barb Mason, the individual who filed electronic reports for the committee, also appeared on behalf of the Committee. Much of Ms. Stern's testimony mirrored her Appeal Affidavit. She was assisted in her campaign by her state representative who advised her that she had to file with the Board when she received contributions in excess of \$3,000. She didn't realize that her own money counted towards the threshold. She began mail-outs in December using her credit card. In mid-January she opened an account at a sign shop using her credit card. She was keeping track of outside contributions, but these were few in number and small in size. She won the consolidated primary and then began soliciting information about filing around the middle of March. She was advised by the state representative who was assisting her, to call Cris Cray at the Board. She sought advice from Ms. Cray and assistance on completing the D-1. It is not known what specific questions were asked. She also contacted a couple of CPAs asking advice as well. One told her that after she filed the D-1 that she was fine until July. In July, she finally was put in contact with Barb Mason who helped sort out all of her personal expenditures and then determined that the threshold was crossed January 2, 2007, not in April as she originally thought. Ms. Sterns had no idea how much of her own money she had spent or obligated until this point. She had not run a balance of how much was charged on her VISA until the election. She currently has \$69 left in her account. She stresses that these violations were unintentional. I asked her if she had been given the D-1 Notice of Obligation at the time she had filed her petitions, and she did not remember.

Section 10 ILCS 5/9-1.7 defines a 'local political committee' as a candidate, or any individual, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or any other organization or group of persons which "(a) accepts contributions or grants or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for public office who are required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interest with the County Clerk, or on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for election to the office of ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population;..." The key phrase in this definition is "makes expenditures". Ms. Sterns, the candidate, made expenditures by charging items on her credit card, exceeding \$3,000 by early January. As expenditures, they count towards the \$3,000 threshold. She acknowledges being a novice and relying upon the advice of another office holder. She talks about seeking advice from various individuals, including Board employees in late March and in April; however, the \$3,000 threshold was crossed in early January, so deadlines for the D-1, the Schedule A-1s for the Consolidated Primary Election, the Pre-Election Report for the Consolidated Election, and possibly some Schedule A-1 filings for the Consolidated Election, had passed before any contact was made with the Board. In addition, the Board sent her a letter dated April 9, 2007; this is a generic letter sent by staff when information comes into its possession that would indicate that a committee may be required to file. When asked if she had received her D-5 Notice of Obligation when she filed her petitions, she wasn't sure since it had been so long ago. Ms. Sterns served as her own chairman and treasurer, and given her relative inexperience, I'm sure, in retrospect, she would agree that this may not have been a good idea due to the extreme pressures involved in running a campaign. Being a first time candidate in a difficult race would have been a very time consuming experience. However, her failure to file was due to her lack of understanding of the law; as far as information she may or may not have gotten from the Board, these phone calls were made well into the campaign.

The Board provides many educational resources, beginning with the D-5 she would have gotten when she filed her petitions, and all the materials available on the Board website. These materials would have answered any questions she had regarding her obligation to file disclosure. Therefore, I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. In regards to the Schedule A-1 penalties, since there is no indication that these violations were anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, I also recommend that the A-1 penalties be reduced to 10% of the original assessment or \$214. That \$214, plus the penalties for delinquently filing the D-1 and the two pre-election reports total \$4,314. If this recommendation is accepted by the Board, the total amount of \$4,314 will be due and owing.

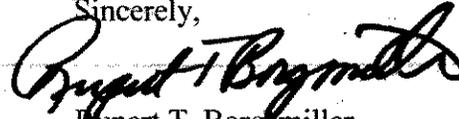

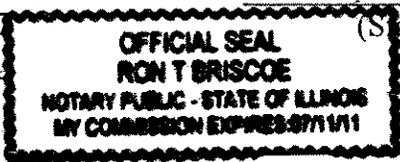

When I made a decision to run for Alderman, Ward 4, City of Bloomington in December of '06, I received the following advice from a friend who had held public office in the State of Illinois for several years, "You do not need to file a committee until you have received more than \$3,000.00 in campaign contributions." I knew that I would not be soliciting or receiving contributions until after the 2/23/07 primary election, so I believed I had no reason to file a committee until at least I began to receive contributions. I had no idea and no reason to think that spending money on my own campaign was the same as receiving it. I further had no idea of the large cost of campaigning and opened an account at a printer for my direct mailings and authorized charges on my Visa card without always receiving a statement. Since I did not pay off my Visa card and have run a balance since the campaign, I feel as if I still have not actually paid off my campaign expenses. My current Visa balance is larger than my campaign expenditures.

My campaign was hotly contested with 4 others in the primary and a 10 year incumbent in the general election. This was my first time to run for any office or even to be seriously involved in a campaign. Self employed, I was not able to devote much time to my work or business in order to campaign full time.

In late March of '07, I realized I might approach the \$3,000.00 limit of contributions, so I then felt I should file a committee. A friend pulled up the forms for me and I began the first of several calls to Springfield to make sure I was filing correctly. I was told by the same friend as above that I should call Chris Cray, which I did. She was helpful in some questions I had about how to fill out the D-1, but she did not refer me to the election board, so I still did not realize I was late.

I received a letter from the State Board 4/9/07 advising me of the need to file a committee. On 4/10 I filed a D-1 form. I talked to Chris Cray at least one other time and I also made an appointment with a CPA in Bloomington to see if I was doing the right thing, but she could not advise me. I made calls to the Board of Elections on 4/3, 4/6, 4/10/07 and on 7/13 and 7/17, finally convincing someone at the Board to give me the name of someone who could help me because I realized I was not capable of filing the 7/20 report myself. At last I contacted Ms. Barbara Mason who I was able to contract with to file my 7/20 report.

I then received an amnesty letter from you on 9/30/07. The next day I received a letter dated 4/30/07 that notified me of a civil penalty. Although the letter is dated 4/30/07, it is assessing a penalty for reports received in July of '07.

At this time I have a remainder of \$97.00 left in my committee fund, although I still owe over \$10,500 to myself. Again, my Visa balance still owing is greater than my campaign deficit--so I still feel as if I have not yet paid for my campaign.

In conclusion, the misinformation I received combined with my complete inexperience in running for office were the reason my committee was not filed in time. My mistakes

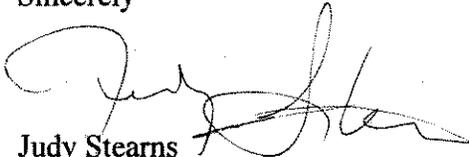
were entirely unintentional and were made because even calling the State Board numerous times did not give me the understanding that spending and receiving were the same. When I at last realized that I had not filed properly, I contacted 2 professionals—one in Bloomington who could not help and at last Barbara Mason, who was a great help, without whom, I am afraid I still would be attempting to do this correctly. Had I not found Barbara, I intended to make a trip to Springfield to speak directly with the State Board before 7/20.

My attempts to get the correct information and my willingness to hire an expert are, I believe, evidence that I put forth a sincere effort to file correctly.

The campaign was a tremendous sacrifice, financially, emotionally, and physically and my business and personal life suffered more than I ever thought they would. I am still recovering while striving hard to serve my constituents and be the best possible alderman I can be.

I sincerely thank you for your consideration of my explanation and look forward to meeting with you.

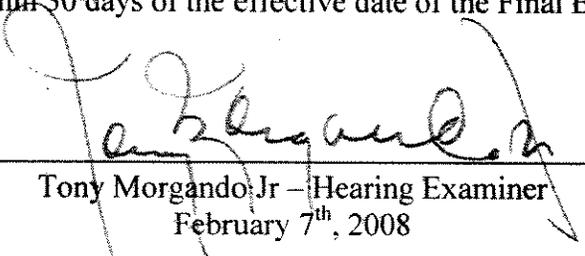
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Failure to File Schedule A-1's
in conjunction with the February 2007 Consolidated Primary Election

According to the political committee's June 2007 Semi Annual Report, it received two (2) contributions totaling \$10,750.00, during the Schedule A-1 filing period, January 29th, 2007 through and including February 26th, 2007, which failed to be reported as required by statute. The political committee is fined an assessed civil penalty in the amount of \$10,750.00.

Ms. Carina Sanchez, Candidate/Chairman filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on January 17th, 2008, indicating as good reason or defense: "The committee received the checks after the date of the election thereby not being affected by the 2-day requirement. The committee mistakenly listed the date on the checks instead of the date received by the campaign".

Hearing in this matter was set for Tuesday, January 29th, 2008, to be telephonically conducted on/or about 10:00 a.m. As stated on the political committee's appeal affidavit, Ms. Sanchez indicated the contributions in question were listed as the date issued not received by the campaign. The Hearing Examiner made a request of Ms. Sanchez, that copies of such checks, and bank statements reflecting their deposit, be secured and forwarded to his attention. The requested documents were received by the Hearing Examiner on Wednesday, February 6th, 2008. Such documents indicated that both contributions were written on February 26th, 2007, one (1) deposited on February 28th, 2007, and the other n March 5th, 2007.

After reviewing the documents requested in this matter, it is the opinion of the Hearing Examiner that the contributions appear to have been received after the date of the February 27th, 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, thus not required to be filed on a Schedule A-1. Therefore, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be granted in this matter. I further recommend that the committee file an amended June 2007 Semi-annual report to correctly reflect the date of receipt of the contributions in question within 30 days of the effective date of the Final Board Order.

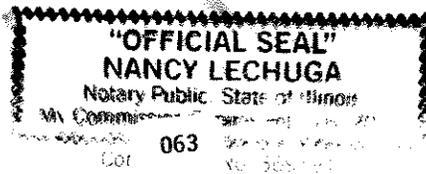
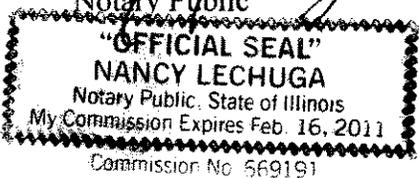

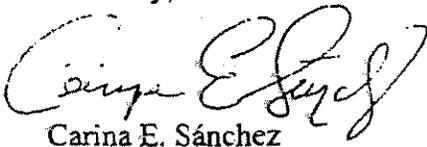

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Failure to File Schedule A-1's
In conjunction with the April 2007 Consolidated Election

According to the political committee's June 2007 Semi Annual Report, it received ten (10) in-kind contributions totaling \$26,865.82, during the Schedule A-1 filing period, March 19th, 2007 through and including April 16th, 2007, which failed to be reported as required by statute. The political committee is fined an assessed civil penalty in the amount of \$26,865.82.

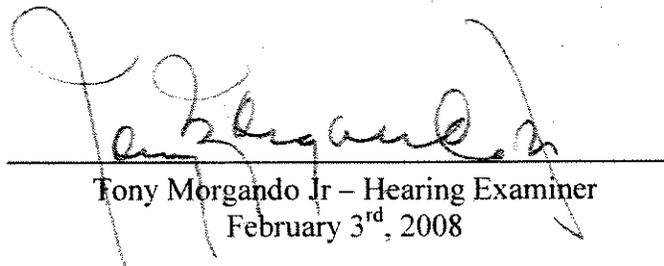
Mr. Sam Rivers, Treasurer, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on January 10th, 2008, indicating as good reason or defense: "The in-kind contributions from Local 881 UFCW on 3/31/07, 4/7/07 and 4/14/07 of \$1149.50 each were previously reported on the A-1's on 3/30/07, 4/6/07 and 4/13/07. Due to a change in book keeper, these contributions were double counted. The reported A-1's are attached. The in-kind notification from SEIU IL PAC totaling \$15,975.72 was received on 4/23/07. The in-kind notification from SEIU Local 880 totaling \$3436.59 was received on 4/30/07. The committee does not have documentation for a Teamsters contribution on 4/12. The remaining SEIU IL PAC contributions on 4/13 and 4/12 were not discovered by the Committee until after the election. The Committee made a good faith effort to consolidate and report all in-kind contributions to the best of our knowledge for the semi-annual report even though in-kind notifications were found after the election"

Hearing in this matter was set for Wednesday, January 30th, 2008, to be conducted at the Board's Chicago office, 100 W. Randolph, 14th Floor, at 10:00 a.m.

Ms. Marina Martinez, Campaign Manager (Treasurer prior to 9/25/07), Mr. Samuel Rivers, Treasurer, and Mr. Tim Drea, Representative of Local 881 UFCW, appeared on behalf of the Respondent(s). Ms. Martinez indicated (1) that the three (3) \$1,149.50 in-kind contributions disclosed on Schedule A-1's, reflecting receipt dates of 3/30/07, 4/6/07 and 4/13/07 (attached), were inadvertently reported on the political committee's June 2007 Semi-Annual Report as double-entries indicating dates of 3/31/07, 4/7/07 and 4/14/07 (attached); (2) Ms. Martinez provided copies of four (4) In-Kind Notification forms, related to the SEIU Illinois Council PAC in-kinds, three (3) dated 4/13/04 and the remaining notification dated 4/12/07 (attached). Ms.

Martinez noted such notifications were faxed on Friday, April 13th, 2007, at 5:22 p.m. Mr. Tim Drea, stated such in-notifications were sent from the SEIU Illinois Council PAC, to his attention at the Local 881 UFCW office, located in Rosemont, Illinois. Mr. Drea indicated that such notifications were delivered to Ms. Martinez after the Tuesday, April 17th, 2007 Election. Ms. Martinez stated the campaign office of Friends to Elect Toni Foulkes, located at 3006 W. 63rd St, Chicago, Illinois, was closed on Monday, April 16th, 2007; (3) Ms. Martinez indicated the in-kind contribution received from Local 880 PAC, in the amount of \$3,436.59, was reported as the date reflected on the In-Kind Notification form, not as of the date such notification was received, which according to the fax transmission record, was April 30, 2007, after the April 17th, 2007 Election (attached); (4) Ms. Martinez indicated the in-kind contribution received from SEIU IL Council PAC, in the amount of \$15,975.82, was reported as the date reflected on the In-Kind Notification form, not as of the date such notification was received, which according to the fax transmission record, was April 23rd, 2007, after the date of the election (attached), and (5) Ms. Martinez provided the Hearing Examiner with twenty-two (22) In-Kind Notification forms, indicating payment of \$31.25, on Friday, April 13th, 2007, to various individuals to man a phone bank, paid for by the Teamsters Joint Council 25. Ms. Martinez stated due to volume of these In-Kind Notification forms, and the absence of any fax transmission record, it is her opinion such documents were delivered to the campaign headquarters, which being closed on Monday, April 16th, 2007, such delivery had to occur after the election.

After reviewing the documents in this matter, and discussions with the Respondent(s), it is the opinion of the Hearing Examiner that in relation to the ten (10) in-kind contributions that purportedly were not filed, three (3) actually were filed and duplicated on the political committee's June 2007 Semi-Annual Report; four (4) were faxed to a location other than the campaign headquarters and subsequently hand-delivered after the election; two (2) were faxed to the political committee after the election as evidenced by the transmission record attached to the In-Kind Notification form, and one (1) in the amount of \$31.25, appears to have been received by the political committee after the election. Therefore, it is the opinion of the Hearing Examiner that good reason or defense has been presented and recommends the appeal is granted in this matter. I further recommend that the committee file an amended June 2007 Semi-annual report to correctly reflect the date of receipt of the contributions in question within 30 days of the effective date of the Final Board Order.

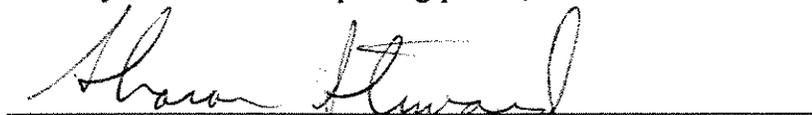
**Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment For Failure to File a Schedule A-1
For the 2007 Consolidated Election**

This Committee received 1 contribution of \$2000 on 3/28/07, but failed to list it on a Schedule A-1. This contribution was reported on the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report. The assessed penalty is \$2000.

Lisa Patel, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, the Treasurer stated that the \$2000 loan from Stephen Alderman was received on March 14, 2007, not March 28, 2007 as reflected in the report. The computer form would not allow the entry of any date prior to March 28, 2007 when she was inputting the information. A copy of the check is attached. It was received on the date of the check, March 14, 2007. Heather Alderman, the Candidate, also submitted a memo reiterating what was stated on the Treasurer's affidavit. In addition, the Treasurer submitted a copy of the check, dated 3/14/07, and a deposit slip for the amount of \$2925 deposited on 3/14/07. Included with the deposit slip were copies of the checks deposited on that date, which total \$2925.

I recommend that the appeal be granted. Based upon the affidavit submitted by the Treasurer and the additional documentation showing the deposit date of the check, it is clear that the check was received on 3/14/07, rather than 3/28/07. In addition, her explanation of her inability to enter the 3/14/07 date makes sense in that only dates within the reporting period can be entered. Since this was prior to the committee's date of creation, it could not be entered as a loan on the 3/14/07 date. Since the receipt date was outside of the 30-day Schedule A-1 reporting period, a Schedule A-1 did not need to be filed.

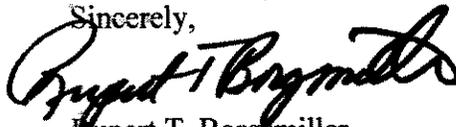

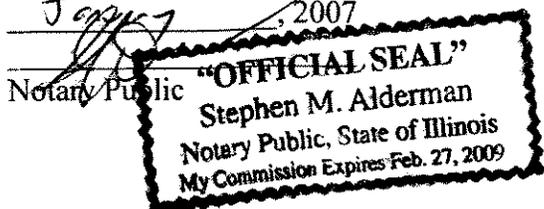

As you can see, we raised just under \$7,000.00 to support this election effort. I hired counsel to assist with this process. The chronology of events for this committee was as follows:

- 3/14/2007: Stephen Alderman, my husband, made a \$2,000.00 loan to the campaign by way of the attached check.**
- 3/14/2007: That same date our contributions exceeded \$3,000.00**
- 3/20/2007: I provided to James Nally, my attorney the D-1 form for filing**
- 3/27/2007: within 10 business days of 3/14/2007, Mr. Nally filed the D-1 form.**

Subsequently, when my treasurer, Lisa Patel, went to fill out the forms on-line, the computer form would not allow her to put in any contribution dates prior to the 3/28/2007 date. We did not understand that that could cause a problem with the reporting. However, the \$2,000.00 contribution was made more than 30 days prior to the election, and as we understood it, was not required to be reported until the regular report, as opposed to under the 2 day requirement.

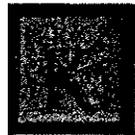

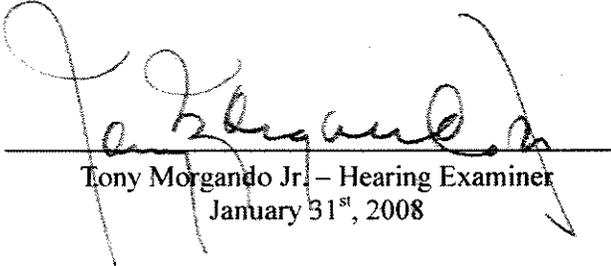
The political committee's June 2007 Semi-Annual Report was received by the State Board of Elections (herein referred to as SBE) on December 7th, 2007, eighty-eighty (88) days late. As such, the political committee has been assessed a fine of \$4,400.00. In addition, the political committee was previously assessed a penalty of \$100.00 for the delinquent filing of the Pre-Election Report for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election. The total assessment is \$4,500.00.

Mr. Faruq-Al-Amin, Chairman, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on January 10th, 2008, indicating as an offer of good reason or defense, "bank account statements – receipts for purchases – phone bills – Peoples gas – rent – food & refreshments".

Hearing in this matter was set for Wednesday, January 30th, 2008, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 9:30 a.m.

Mr. Julius Anderson, Candidate, appeared on behalf of the political committee. Mr. Anderson indicated that attempts were made to electronically file the report, but those initially attempts were unsuccessful. Mr. Anderson stated after numerous conversations with Board staff, was the political committee able to file the delinquent report. Mr. Anderson indicated the political committee had no funds, simply a significant debt owed to him. Mr. Anderson requested staff assistance to prepare and file a Final Report. Such Final Report, terminating the political committee's campaign activity was filed as of the date of the hearing, Wednesday, January 30th, 2008.

I feel based upon a review of the documents/statements presented in this matter, and consideration of a prior filing delinquency, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied, and the assessed fine of \$4,500.00 be due and owing. However, noting that the political committee has filed a Final Report, it is recommended that the assessed civil penalty be abated if the political committee remains dissolved for a period of two (2) years following the date of the Final Order of the Board imposing the penalty.

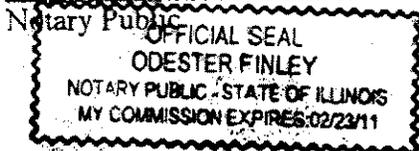

For the April 2007 Consolidated Election

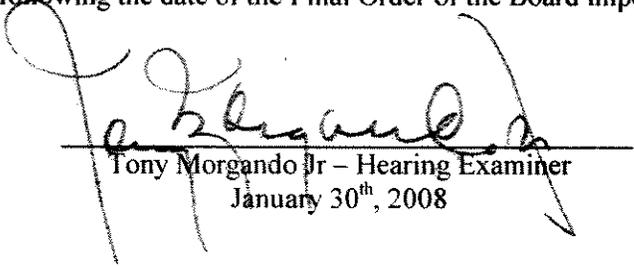
According to the political committee's June 2007 Semi Annual Report, it received two (2) contributions from Citizens for Roth, dated April 13th (\$7,000.00) and April 6th (\$780.00), during the Schedule A-1 filing period, March 19th, 2007 through and including April 16th, 2007, which failed to be reported as required by statute. The political committee is fined an assessed civil penalty in the amount of \$7,780.00.

Mr. Gary A. Patterson, Chairman, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on January 17th, 2008, indicating in part: "On or about April 13, 2007 I called the State Board of Elections regarding the contribution from Citizens for Roth in the amount of \$7,000 and requested advice regarding said contribution and the requirement for filing reports electronically. I was advised that current reports would be not be required to be filed but that the future reports would be required to be filed electronically".

Hearing in this matter was set for Tuesday, January 29th, 2008, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, Suite 14-100, at 10:30 a.m.

Mr. James Nally, counsel, appeared on behalf of the political committee. Mr. Nally indicated the political committee filed a Final Report, terminating its activity in the state of Illinois on Wednesday, December 5th, 2007.

After reviewing the documents in this matter, it is the opinion of the Hearing Examiner that the political committee failed to file required Schedule A-1's in the 2007 April Consolidated General Election. Therefore, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied. Since this is the first delinquent filing of Schedule A-1's by the political committee, and a Final Report has been filed, it is recommended that the assessed civil penalty be reduced to 10% or \$778.00, and such penalty be abated if the political committee remains dissolved for a period of two (2) years following the date of the Final Order of the Board imposing the penalty.

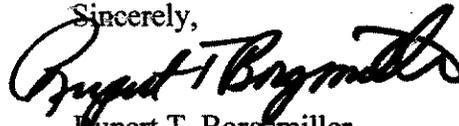

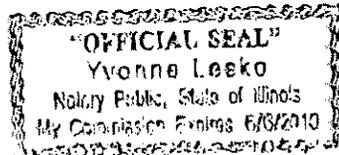

Statement of Organization and June 2007 Semi-Annual Report**

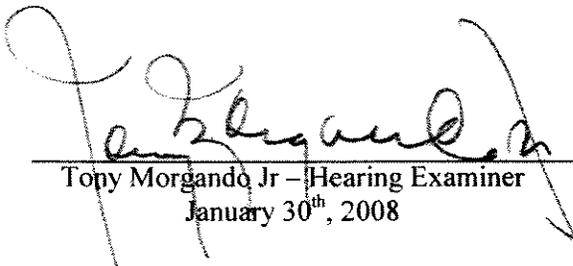
According to the State Board of Elections index, the political committee's D-1, Statement of Organization was received by the Board on August 2nd, 2007, 72-day(s) late. The political committee also filed its June 2007 Semi-Annual Report on August 2nd, 2007, 2-day(s) late. The political committee is fined a total assessed civil penalty in the amount of \$1,900.00.

Ms. Susie Barber, Candidate/Treasurer, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on January 2nd, 2008, indicating as good reason or defense, "will present at Hearing".

Hearing in this matter was set for Tuesday, January 29th, 2008, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, Suite 14-100, at 11:00 a.m.

Ms. Susie Barber appeared on behalf of the political committee. Ms. Barber indicated she was a 1st time candidate seeking election to the City of Joliet Council, District #4. Ms. Barber stated there was no willful intent to file documents late and assured the Hearing Examiner, if required in the future, reports would be submitted in a timely manner. Ms. Barber indicated that a Final Report terminating her campaign activity was filed on August 2nd, 2007.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied, and the total assessed fine of \$1,900.00 be due and owing. However, noting that the political committee did file a Final Report, it is recommended that the assessed civil penalty be abated if the political committee remains dissolved for a period of two (2) years following the date of the Final Order of the Board imposing the penalty.

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

The political committee on April 13th, 2007, filed the following disclosure reports late with the State Board of Elections (herein referred to as SBE), (1) A Statement of Organization, Form D-1, indicating a creation date of October 1st, 2004, 615 days late (\$5,000); (2) A December 2004 Semi-Annual Report, 547 days late (\$5,000); (3) A Pre-Election Report, for the April, 2005 Consolidated Election, 11 days late (\$2,200); (4) A June 2005 Semi-Annual Report, 421 days late (\$5,000); (5) A December 2005 Semi-Annual Report, 298 days late (\$5,000); (6) A June 2006 Semi-Annual Report, 173 days late (\$5,000); (7) A December 2006 Semi-Annual Report, 50 days late (\$5,000); (8) A Pre-Election Report, for the April 2007 Consolidated Election, 9 days late (\$3,600), and; (9) the failure of the political committee to file a Schedule A-1, for the April 2007 Consolidated Election (\$5,497.12). As such, the political committee has been assessed a total fine of \$41,297.12.

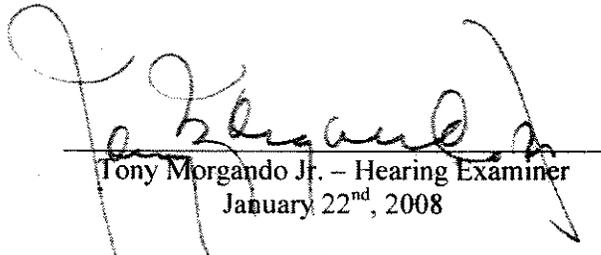
Ms. Anne Bridges, Treasurer, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on November 19th, 2007, indicating "change of officers and extenuating circumstances" as good reason or defense to the assessment of the civil penalty.

Hearing in this matter was set for Wednesday, January 16th, 2008, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 10:30 a.m.

Ms. Amy Kunz, Lisa Nuss, Chairman, Anne Bridges, Treasurer, and Mr. James Nally, Counsel, appeared on behalf of the political committee. The Respondent(s) indicated that Ms. Anne Bridges assumed the position of Classroom Teachers Council IPACE Treasurer in January, 2007. Ms. Bridges stated that a review of the financial records indicated the prior Treasurer, Mr. Denny Ryza, opened a bank account for the organization in 2004. Ms. Bridges stated her review revealed that the organization's balance as of October 1st, 2004, exceeded \$3,000, which required the organization to file documents establishing a political committee on its behalf. Ms. Bridges indicated all statements and reports required to be filed beginning from the political committee's date of creation, October 1st, 2004, through the Pre-Election Report for the April, 2007 Consolidated Election, were filed on April 13th, 2007. The Respondent(s) stated all subsequent reports have been filed in a timely manner.

Based upon a review of statements/documents presented in this matter, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied, and the assessed civil penalty totaling \$36,350.00 be STAYED as a first violation. This amount includes the reduction of the \$5497.12 Schedule A-1 assessment to \$550.00 (10% of the value of the delinquently reported contribution).

Such recommendation is consistent with similar rulings in SBE v. Chicagoland Apartment Association PAC (06 MA 001), and SBE v. Black Illinois Legislative Lobby (06 MA 002).

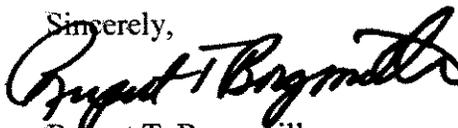
