The regular monthly meeting of the State Board of Elections was called to order at 10:30 a.m. with eight members present. Member Brady was present via telephonic connection.

Chairman Smart opened the meeting by leading everyone in the pledge of allegiance.

The Executive Director noted that every two years the election of a new chairman and new vice chairman is held. Also, if new members are appointed they would take office today. However, there was no action on the appointment process so the current members will continue to serve until current members are reappointed or new ones are confirmed. The first order of business is the election of the new Chairman and new Vice Chairman. Director White then recognized outgoing Chairman Smart and noted how fortunate he was to serve with two fine Chairmen since his appointment as Executive Director. Director White noted that these past two years have been challenging but Chairman Smart provided great leadership and was endorsed by the county clerks for reappointment to the Board. On behalf of the Board and staff, Director White presented Chairman Smart with an engraved gavel commemorating his two years as Chairman and thanked him for his service to the State Board of Elections and the State of Illinois. Chairman Smart thanked Director White and noted his appreciation for the tremendous staff of the State Board of Elections. He thanked the Board members for working together with him and their support for his term as Chairman.

Member Keith thanked Mrs. Susan Smart for her assistance in communication with Mr. Smart during his term.

At this time Chairman Smart called for the election of officers, beginning with chairman. Member McGuffage nominated Albert Porter for Chairman. Member Schneider seconded the nomination. With no objections, the motion was called and passed unanimously.

Newly elected Chairman Porter thanked the Board for the opportunity to serve as Chairman for the next two years and indicated his open door leadership.

Chairman Porter then opened the floor for nominations for Vice Chairman. Member Smart nominated Bryan Schneider to serve as Vice Chairman. With there being no further nominations and no objections the motion for election of Vice Chairman passed unanimously. At this time the Board took a recess for a Board picture. Meeting recessed at 10:50 a.m. and reconvened at 11:00 a.m.

Chairman Porter presented the minutes of the June 11, 2007 regular monthly Board meeting. Director White discussed revisions submitted by Member Keith and minutes reflecting those revisions were distributed to Board members. Member Rednour moved to approve the minutes as amended. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

Director White thanked and commended the outgoing Chairman and Vice Chairman for their service the past two years and congratulated the new Chairman and Vice Chairman.

A legislative update was distributed to the Board and it was noted the legislature met in extended session this month and just last week passed an interim 30 day budget. Cris Cray discussed legislative activity noting that the Governor signed the bill which moves the primary to February 5, 2008 and there are two pending election bills. In response to a question Ms. Cray indicated that the SBE budget submitted for FY08 has requested funds to cover electronic canvassing. Member Keith suggested staff research the possibility of requesting the *King* supplemental being moved to a one month budget as a separate bill away from the bill it is currently attached to.

The Executive Director presented an informational update on HAVA funds and noted the steps that are being taken to conform with the federal audit. Correspondence was sent to all election authorities indicating items that impact them: 1) complying with the signed Agreements and timely expending the funds, 2) maintaining proper inventory records and 3) checking the excluded party list before making any purchase with HAVA funds. A letter was also sent to the three jurisdictions that had inadequate records of equipment inventory. Work continues on receiving records necessary to assess interest charges to the three jurisdictions found not to be in compliance with timely expenditure of funds. Director White indicated that although we were attempting to return funds from our FY07 budget to repay the \$3,800 for voter education activity books that were ruled an inappropriate expense the Comptroller's office indicated that it can only be paid through a separate appropriation.

The Executive Director noted that with the short time between the June and July meetings the FY07 fiscal report for the period ending June 30, 2007 and the fiscal report for the Help Illinois Vote Fund will be sent to the Board members at a later date. Director White presented the two year plan of activity for the months of July and August noting that it is being updated with new dates because of the change to a February primary. Discussion was held on filing dates for established parties and independent candidates and the federal court ruling that indicates the current statute is unconstitutional for independent candidates. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to authorize the General Counsel to contact the Attorney General to seek a declaratory judgment from the Federal Court or offer an opinion on the Federal Court ruling. Member McGuffage seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Member McGuffage asked if staff could consider returning to JCAR on the issue of apparent conformity as he felt this issue should be revisited.

The General Counsel congratulated Chairman Porter and Vice Chairman Schneider. He then presented a motion for reconsideration in the matter of *SBE v. Phillips for Mayor*, 07DS047. The committee was assessed a penalty of \$575 and was planning on attending the previous meeting but

was involved in a car accident and did not make it. Mr. Phillips would still like to appeal the penalty. There is question of whether notice was received of today's meeting. Mr. Sandvoss suggested postponing this matter until the August or September meeting at which time notice would be given and Mr. Phillips could attend. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to grant the motion for reconsideration and schedule this matter for the September meeting. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented appeals of campaign disclosure fines that the hearing officer recommends be granted in the matters of agenda items 3.a.2-3 and noted his concurrence with the hearing officer recommendations. No one was present in these matters. Member Smart moved to grant the appeals in the matters of *SBE v. Friends of Debbie Halvorson*, 06AG082, and *SBE v. Friends to Elect Toni Foulkes*, 07AC024. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented appeals of campaign disclosure fines that the hearing officer has recommended be denied in agenda items 3.a.4-10. Representatives were present in agenda items #6, 7 and 9 and Member Keith asked to pull #4 for separate consideration. Mr. Sandvoss discussed *SBE v. Citizens to Elect George Edwards* and concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer although he did sympathize with the large amount of the penalty. George Edwards was presented and apologized for the late filing and asked for reconsideration of the amount of the fine. Mr. Edwards indicated that staff did offer a remedy if he chose to dissolve the committee but he indicated it was not an option at this time. He did not realize that loaning himself money resulted in a filing and he did not do it intentionally. He offered a \$500 settlement. Member Smart moved to accept the offer of \$500. Member Walters seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 6-2 with Members Brady and Keith voting in the negative.

General Counsel Sandvoss presented *SBE v. Randolph County Democratic Central Committee* and concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the appeal be denied. Robert Paulter was present and indicated the committee had a new treasurer who did not realize an A-1 report

was required to be filed. The penalty was already reduced from \$3,000 to \$300 but he requested a smaller amount. Mr. Sandvoss indicated in this situation the statute is very specific and cannot be reduced lower than ten percent. Member Smart moved to accept the recommendation and the appeal be denied. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 7-0-1 with Member Rednour recusing herself from this matter.

The General Counsel presented *SBE v. IL Fire Sprinkler Contractors PAC* indicating his concurrence with the hearing officer's recommendation that the appeal be denied. Margaret Vaughn was present and indicated this is a new committee and there was a lack of communication. Once they were made aware that pre-election reports needed to be filed they did so. Ms. Vaughn realized that this fine could not be reduced below the \$500 but did want the Board to know they take this seriously. Member McGuffage felt that this has to do with national committee to local committees and questioned if it was really a violation. Mr. Sandvoss indicated he felt it was a contribution and to make an exception on this one the Board would have to make an exception on all. Member McGuffage felt that the statutes should be revisited as they are too strict in cases like this. Member Smart moved to accept the recommendation and deny the appeal. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 7-0-1 with Member Keith recusing himself from this matter.

The General Counsel presented *SBE v. Friends of Larry M. Doody, SBE. V. Neighbors for Naisy Dolar*, and *SBE v. Committee to Retain Judge Spears*, and concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the appeals be denied. No one was present in these matters. Member Keith moved to deny the appeals in the above matters. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *SBE v. Citizens for Saville* and agreed with the hearing officer's recommendation. Member Keith disagreed with the recommendation of the hearing officer and felt that the affidavit was sufficient in indicating the report was put in the mail on March 30. Mr. Sandvoss indicated that the statute says there should be no fine if a report is mailed and postmarked within the 72 hours of the due date. Member Keith moved to grant the appeal based on Board rule and

on the affidavit and this be a first time exclusion. Member Walters seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 7-1 with Member Smart voting in the negative.

The General Counsel presented for informational purposes a listing of committees that paid civil penalties.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved to recess to executive session to consider the complaints following closed preliminary hearings and pending litigation. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed unanimously. Meeting recessed at 12:00 p.m. and reconvened at 12:15 p.m. Member Brady left the meeting during Executive Session.

Upon reconvening Member Keith moved in the matter of *SBE v. Citizens for Jim Rowe*, 07CD037 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds and a public hearing be conducted; *SBE v. Committee to Elect John A. Lartz*, 07CD038 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds and a public hearing be conducted; *SBE v. Friends of Angel Rivera for Governor*, 07CD041 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds but no public hearing be conducted as internal proceedings will begin to assess civil penalties for the delinquent filing; *SBE v. 25th Ward Democratic Political Alliance*, 07CD042 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds and a public hearing be conducted; *SBE v. Citizens for Hoyle/James L. Hoyle*, 07CD044 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds but no further action be taken beyond the imposition of a civil penalty; *SBE v. Citizens for Hawkins*, 07CD046 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds and a public hearing be conducted; *SBE v. Citizens for Bilotta/James Bilotta*, 07CD047 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds but no public hearing be conducted and internal proceedings begin to assess civil penalties for the delinquent filing; *SBE v. Citizens for Theodore Thomas*, 07CD048 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds but no public hearing be conducted and internal proceedings begin to assess civil penalties for the delinquent filing; *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Curtis C. Abrams*, 07CD051 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds but no public hearing be conducted and internal proceedings begin to assess civil penalties for the delinquent filing; *SBE v. AARC of Illinois*, 07CD053 the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds but no public hearing be conducted and internal proceedings begin to assess civil penalties

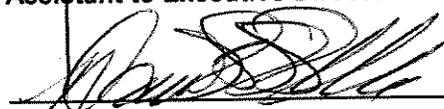
for the delinquent filing. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously with Member Smart voting Member Brady's proxy.

SUBJECT: Preparations for the February 5, 2008 Primary Election Candidate Filing Period

DATE: August 9, 2007

This is to provide the Board an informational update on petition filing preparations.

With the Illinois Primary Election being moved up to February 5, 2008, petition filing dates are now six weeks earlier.

The first day to circulate nominating papers for established political party and independent candidates was August 7. The petition filing period for these candidates is October 29 to November 5, 2007. (There is legislation pending to change the filing period for independent candidates to the same time as new political party candidates, June 16 to June 23, 2008.)

There are two other petition filing periods, a special judicial filing period from November 19 to November 26, 2007 for judicial vacancies which occur between October 15 and November 5, 2007 and the Presidential preference and delegate filing period from November 28 to December 5, 2007. (Republican presidential and delegates only, Democrats have elected to filing during the October 29 – November 5 period.)

SBE preparations are well underway for these filing periods.

We have updated and posted on our website the 2008 Candidate's Guide, 2008 Presidential Preference and Delegate Guide, revised candidate information and downloadable forms, and a listing of judicial vacancies. Updated forms have also been sent to all election authorities and vendors.

Director of Election Information Mark Mossman has conducted several pre-petition filing planning sessions. Since this is a Presidential year and Democratic delegates will file during the October filing period, we anticipate a large number of candidates and media the first day of filing.

At this time, we are in the process of making staff assignments, purchasing necessary equipment and reviewing past practices.

Lastly, there are three objection periods which may require the State Officers Electoral Board to convene to hear cases. Past experience indicates that objections are filed on the last or second to last day. The attached calendar of potential hearing dates has been formulated based on this history. These potential hearing dates are submitted for the Board's consideration.

DATE: August 9, 2007

At the June meeting (attached memo) I reported that we were following up a U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) audit regarding Help America Vote Act (HAVA) funds. This is to update the Board of our progress.

1. We have complied with the finding regarding obtaining revised equipment inventories from three local election jurisdictions and have so notified the EAC (cover letter attached).
2. Continued efforts are being made to retrieve outstanding interest funds from recipients who did not expend funds within thirty days.
3. We will need to request a special appropriation from the legislature for repayment of \$3,889 in HAVA funds.
4. At this time we have no response from the EAC regarding our appeal of the matching funds calculation finding.

SUBJECT: HAVA Funds

DATE: June 22, 2007

At the April Board Meeting I reported that we had received a U. S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) audit regarding Help America Vote Funds (HAVA) expended by Illinois.

Two of the audit findings impact local election jurisdictions. One is an EAC recommendation that we reinforce efforts to ensure timely expenditure of HAVA funds by local jurisdictions and recover any such outstanding funds plus interest, and the second is a recommendation that local jurisdictions provide appropriate inventory records of equipment purchased with HAVA funds. (There were two other findings. We're appealing the calculation of matching state funds and the other requires repayment of a small amount-\$3,889-of HAVA funds.)

Please find attached for your information a memo to all Illinois Elections Authorities that: 1) reinforces our efforts to notify jurisdictions of the obligation to timely expend federal funds; 2) requires local inventories of property purchased with federal funds and; 3) also reinforces a state requirement to check the Excluded Parties List System prior to purchasing goods or services with federal funds.

In addition, notices are being sent to jurisdictions identified in the audit in an effort to retrieve any outstanding federal funds not spent within 30 days including interest.

It has been brought to my attention that an assessment letter sent on May 11, 2004 to the above committee contained an incorrect penalty amount. Their December 2003 Semi-annual report was filed 2 days late, however the amount of the penalty that we assessed the committee was \$600.00, which was incorrect. This was a third violation of the Semi-annual report and the amount should actually have been \$150.00 (2 days at \$75 per day). The board issued a Final Order on July 19, 2004 denying the appeal and indicating a total penalty of \$775.00 due and owing within 30 days. I am asking that the board issue an amended order which correctly reflects the total civil penalty amount of \$325.00 (see chart below).

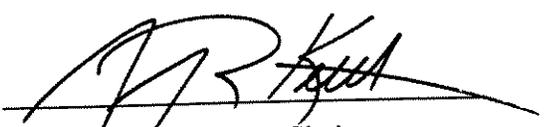
THE BOARD FINDS:

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment
For Delinquently Filing a Semi Annual Report

This Committee delinquently filed the 2003 December Semi Annual Report on February 4, 2004, 2 days late. The assessed penalty is \$600.

John W. Johnsen, the Chairman filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

Mr. Johnsen stated that normally the report is mailed to the Chicago office. This report was inadvertently mailed to the Springfield office. Had it been mailed to Chicago as usual it would have been on time.

Section 125.10(c) states that a report is filed when it is delivered to either the Springfield or Chicago office by the close of business of the prescribed filing date, "or deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, in sufficient time so that the mailed documents will arrive by the close of business of the prescribed filing date." It is unfortunate that the report was inadvertently mailed to the Springfield rather than the Chicago office, but the Committee takes a chance by waiting until late in the filing period to file its report. The responsibility to file reports prior to the deadline lies with the Committee. I therefore recommend that the appeal be denied.

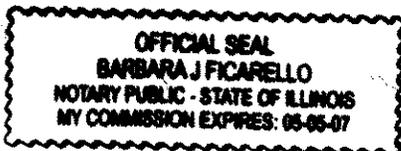

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Failure to File a
Schedule A-1 for 2007 Consolidated Primary Election

This Committee received 2 contributions, one of \$2500 on 1/29/07, and a second of \$2000 on 1/31/07, but failed to list them on a Schedule A-1, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$4500. In addition, the Committee had previously been assessed civil penalties totaling \$276 (appealed, appeal denied, paid in full) for delinquently filing 4 Schedule A-1 reports for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election. The total assessment is \$4500.

Mark R. Valley, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

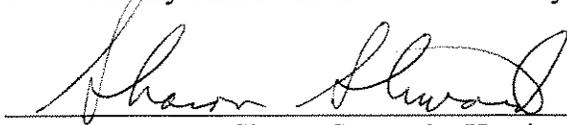
On the Affidavit, Mr. Valley referenced an attached narrative. In it, he stated that the Friends of Larry M. Doody held a fundraiser on January 25, 2007 at Carmichael's Chicago Steak House. On that date, the Committee received a check number 7364 (attached) dated 1/25/07 from Morgan F. Murphy, Jr., in the amount of \$2500. Also on January 25, 2007, Carmichael's Chicago Steak House made an In-kind Contribution to the Committee in the amount of \$2000 (receipt attached). Larry Doody was on the February 27th ballot. These two contributions were received prior to the Schedule A-1 reporting period. The Committee treasurer inadvertently used the date of deposit of Mr. Murphy's check, not the date received. Relative to the in-kind contribution made by Carmichael's Chicago Steak House, the Committee treasurer inadvertently used the date they received the notification of the in-kind contribution, not the date the actual contribution was made. He states that no intentional or technical violation of the reporting requirements occurred. The penalty is a financial hardship on the Committee and they respectfully request that the civil penalty be cancelled.

In regards to the \$2500 check, since the date of the check was the same as the date of the fundraiser it is entirely logical that this check dated 1/25/07 was received on that date. I therefore, recommend that the appeal be granted in regards to this \$2500 contribution from Morgan F. Murphy, Jr., as this was prior to the Schedule A-1 reporting period.

In regards to the in-kind contribution from Carmichael's Chicago Steak House, Section 100.120(c) of the Board's Rules and Regulations reads in part: "...A contribution of goods

actually received by the committee is deemed to be made on the date the goods are transferred to the possession of the recipient. A contribution of services is deemed to be made on the date the services are actually performed..." Attached is a bill for the fundraiser held on 1/25/07, noting the \$2000 donated towards the bill by the House. Therefore, I recommend that the appeal be granted in regards to this \$2000 in-kind contribution, as the date of receipt was prior to the Schedule A-1 reporting period.

In addition, I also recommend that this Committee amend its 2007 June Semi-Annual Report within 30 days of the Final Board Order to show the correct receipt dates for those contributions as well as any others which were incorrectly reported.

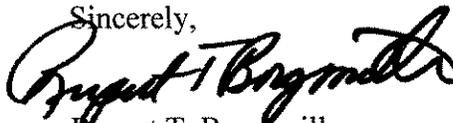

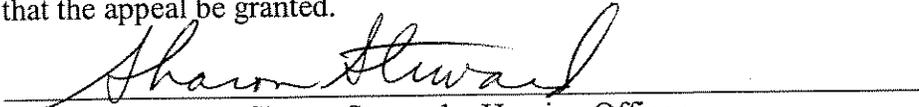

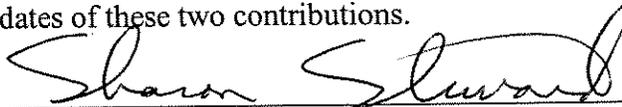

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

According to the political committee's Schedule A-1 report, filed February 23rd, 2007, it received a contribution from Change to Win, dated 2/20/07, in the amount of \$50,000.00, which was filed one (1) day late. The political committee also filed a Schedule A-1 report, on February 28th, 2007, indicating receipt of contributions from SEIU International Union, dated 2/20/07, in the amount of \$200,000.00, which was filed one (1) day late. The political committee has been fined a total of \$250,000.00 for delinquent filing these Schedule A-1 reports.

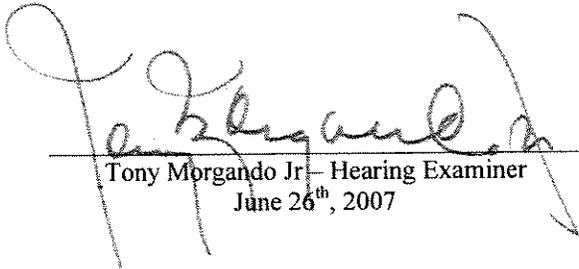
Mr. Gerald Morrison, Treasurer, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on May 29th, 2007, indicating "The Committee disclosed the questioned contributions within two business days of its having knowledge of the contributions in question, and made all possible efforts to gain that knowledge in a timely fashion".

Attached to the Appeal Affidavit was correspondence originating from Mr. Robert W. Page, Senior Vice President, Amalgamated Bank of Chicago, to Ms. Jennifer Holden, Administrative Director, SEIU Illinois Council, dated February 23rd, 2007, which states "Please be advised that SEIU had started inquiring on Tuesday, February 20, 2007 to see if two wires totaling \$250,000 were received. Receipt of these wires was not confirmed to SEIU until some time on Thursday, February 22, 2007".

Hearing in this matter was set for Wednesday, June 13th, 2007, rescheduled by request of Mr. Michael Krelof, counsel, to Monday, June 25th, 2007, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 9:00 a.m.

Ms. Genie Kastrup, Political Director/SEIU Illinois Council, and Mr. Michael Krelof, counsel appeared on behalf of the political committee. Respondent submitted (a) the sworn written Affidavit of Robert Page, Senior Vice President of Amalgamated Bank, indicating "On Thursday, February 22, 2007 the Bank confirmed to PAC agents, (Genie Kastrup, Political Director of SEIU Illinois Council), that the Wires, in fact had been received on February 20, 2007, and the wired sums constituted presently available funds in the Account"; and, (b) the sworn written Affidavit of Kathleen Benton, Administrative Director, SEIU Illinois Council, indicating "I was told by Genie (Kastrup) that the funds were confirmed to us, for the first time, on Thursday, February 22, 2007. The tardy confirmation to us from Amalgamated Bank prevented us from spending these monies until February 22, 2007".

Based upon a review of the documents/statements submitted, it is apparent the political committee received the contributions (Wired) on Thursday, February 22nd, 2007, rather than as indicated on the filed Schedule A-1, Tuesday, February 20th, 2007. As such, the Schedule A-1 was filed in a timely manner; therefore it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be GRANTED in this matter.

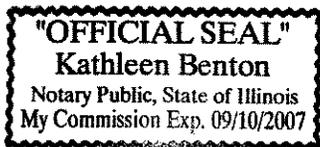

3. I am aware of two February, 2007 wire transfers into the Account, one from Change to Win for \$50,000.00, and one from SEIU International Union for \$200,000.00 (collectively, the "Wires").
4. On Thursday, February 22, 2007 the Bank confirmed to PAC agents for the first time (to Genie Kastrup, the Political Director of SEIU Illinois Council), that the Wires, in fact, had been received on February 20, 2007, and the wired sums constituted presently available funds in the Account.

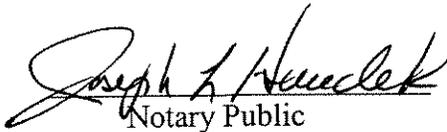

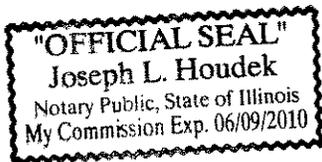

When I returned to the office on Friday, February 23, 2007, I was told by Genie that the funds were confirmed to us, for the first time, on Thursday, February 22, 2007. I promptly contacted our accountants, Bansley & Kiener, LLP, and provided them the necessary information to file the required A-1 filings the same day. 4. The A-1 notices relevant to this hearing were filed with the State Board of Elections one business day after receipt of the funds by the PAC was known to us for the very first time.

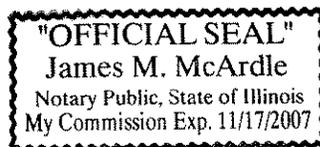

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment

For Delinquently Filing a Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election

This Committee received 3 contributions on 3/20/07, one of \$775, a second of \$2000, and a third of \$1650. The total assessed penalty is \$4425.

Anna Klocek, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit Ms. Klocek stated that the contributions reported by fax on February 23rd were reported by mistake as of the 20th for the following reasons: Idea Furniture owners promised to contribute to the elections mailing by sending a check for \$775. Since they did not do it in a timely manner Ms. Klocek picked it up personally the night of February 22nd. The contributions of \$2000 and \$1650 were actually charges to credit cards to cover costs of a mailing. The Kloceks approved the mailing with their marketing company, Grainger, on the 20th, but it took a couple of days to move balances between two credit cards to pay for the mailing. When Grainger Terry Company assured them that the mailing had been sent and credit charges got accepted, they included these charges on the A-1 form, containing the \$775 charge – all of them with the wrong date (February 20th instead of February 22nd).

I contacted Ms. Klocek on June 6th in order to secure additional documentation in support of her defense. In regards to the \$775 contribution from Idea Furniture, she submitted a letter from Marek Kowalczyk, the President of Idea Furniture, which stated that Ms. Klocek did indeed pick up the \$775 contribution from Idea Furniture on February 22nd.

In regards to the two contributions from Andrzej Klocek, husband of the candidate, of \$2000 and \$1650 on 2/20/07, Jonathan Bedi of Grainger Terry, Inc, submitted two letters. These letters stated that two charges were made on two credit cards in the name of Andrzej Klocek, the first, \$2000, on 2/20/07, and the second, \$1650, on 2/21/07. The mailing was mailed after the second payment was received. Also in regards to these two contributions, Ms. Klocek stated in a letter that the credit cards were family personal credit cards. Ms. Klocek and her husband, Andrzej Klocek, are jointly making payments.

My recommendation follows. In regards to the \$775 contribution from Idea Furniture that was originally reported as being received on 2/20/07 with a Schedule A-1 filed on 2/23/07, I recommend that the appeal be granted. Ms. Klocek's affidavit and the letter from the President of Idea Furniture both state that Ms. Klocek picked up the check from Idea Furniture on 2/22/07. Therefore, the Schedule A-1 filing on 2/23/07 was timely.

In regards to the contributions of \$2000 and \$1650 reported as being received from Mr. Klocek on 2/20/07, I also recommend that the appeal be granted. I offer two separate justifications for making this recommendation. First, although the first contribution, the \$2000 amount, was charged on 2/20/07, the mailing did not occur until after 2/21/07; therefore, I believe the Schedule A-1 filed on 2/23/07 was a timely filing. Secondly, these two contributions were charges on credit cards for which both Mr. and Mrs. Klocek are responsible; i.e., it was the candidate's own money. Since it has been the policy of the Board not to assess penalties if a candidate fails to file a Schedule A-1 if it is the candidate's own money, and if it is a first time violation, I believe this policy should apply in this situation as well.

In conclusion, I recommend that the appeal be granted in regards to all three contributions. If this recommendation is accepted by the Board, I also recommend that this Committee file an amended 2007 Semi-Annual Report showing the correct receipt dates of these contributions.

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for the Failure to File the
November 2006 Pre-Election Election Report; Failure to File Schedule
A-1 Reports for the November, 2006 General Election, and Failure to
File Schedule A-1 Reports for the February, 2007 Primary Election

According to the political committee's December 2006 Semi-Annual Report, it made an expenditure towards the candidacy of Todd Stroger on September 22nd, 2006, in the amount of \$750.00. Such expenditure would require the filing of a Pre-Election report for the November 7th, 2006 General Election, rather than a Non-Participation Report as filed by the political committee on October 23rd, 2006. A civil penalty in the amount of \$2,200.00 has therefore been assessed.

The political committee also failed to file required Schedule A-1's in relation to the November 7th, 2006 General Election, disclosing the following contributions; Chicago Community Development Corp, dated 10/13/06, in the amount of \$1,000.00; Larry Huggins, dated 10/17/06, in the amount of \$1,500.00, and Sam Sianis, dated 10/12/06, in the amount of \$1,000.00. A civil penalty in the amount of \$3,500.00 has therefore been assessed.

The political committee also failed to file in a timely fashion Schedule A-1's in relation to the February 27th, 2007 Consolidated Primary Election. The political committee filed seven (7) Schedule A-1's on Thursday, February 15th, 2007, which contained six (6) contributions received on Saturday, February 10th, 2007, and thirty-three (33) contributions received on Monday, February 12th, 2007 (Lincoln's Birthday), totally \$78,150.00. The filing of these Schedule A-1's were one (1) day late, causing a civil penalty in the amount of \$78,150.00 to be assessed.

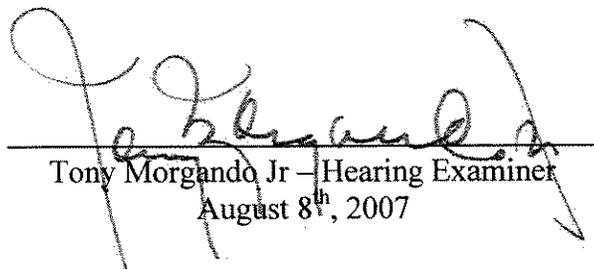
Mr. Spellman Jones, Treasurer, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on May 21st, 2007, indicating: "2/12/07 was a holiday (Lincoln's Birthday) and the office of the Alderman was closed. The received date for contributions should have been 2/13/07".

Hearing in this matter was set for Wednesday, June 13th, 2007, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 10:30 p.m.

Mr. Spellman Jones, Treasurer, appeared on behalf of the political committee. Mr. Jones indicated that he filed a Non-Participation Report in relation to the November 7th, 2006 General Election because the political committee expended no funds to support a candidate on the ballot prior to the close of the Pre-Election Reporting period. Mr. Jones stated it was his understanding the requirement to file Schedule A-1's did not apply to political committee's submitting a Non-Participation Report.

In terms of the Schedule A-1's, filed one (1) day late in relation to the February 27th, 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, which disclosed thirty-three (33) contributions, the Hearing Examiner extended the hearing to Wednesday, July 18th, 2007, at 10:30 a.m., to allow the Respondent the opportunity to secure copies of checks for examination to determine the actual date of receipt and deposit. The Respondent or their representative failed to appear at such hearing, nor any response received from telephonic messages.

Based upon a review of the documents/statements submitted in this matter, the Hearing Examiner finds that (a) The political committee "having filed a Statement of Non-Participation" made "an expenditure in excess of \$500 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate that will appear on the ballot at the next election" did not "file a pre-election report within five days after making the expenditure", Rule 100.70(e). Therefore it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied, and the assessed fine of \$2,200.00 be due and owing; (b) The political committee being required to file a Pre-Election Report for the November 7th, 2006 General Election, failed to submit Schedule A-1's, as required in 10 ILCS 5/9-10(b-5). Therefore it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied. Considering this is the first delinquent Schedule A-1 filing by the political committee, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the assessed penalty be reduced 10% or \$350.00, and is due and owing; (c) The political committee failed to appear Wednesday, July 18th, 2007, to allow an examination of contribution data by the Hearing Examiner to substantiate their appeal. Therefore a review of the Schedule A-1's filed in conjunction with the February 2007 Consolidated Primary election by the Hearing Examiner indicates such documents were filed one (1) day late. It is therefore the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied. Considering this is the second delinquent Schedule A-1 filing by the political committee, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the assessed penalty be reduced 50% or \$39,075.00, and is due and owing, and (d) The political committee having filed a Final Report on Thursday, August 2nd, 2007, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the total assessed civil penalty of \$41,625.00 be abated if the political committee remains dissolved for a period of two (2) years following the date of the Final Order of the Board imposing the penalty

A committee which, having filed a Statement of Non-Participation, makes a subsequent contribution to a candidate who will appear on the ballot at the next election shall file a Pre-Election Report within five days after making the contribution, or if the contribution is made during the five days immediately prior to the election, within 24 hours after making the contribution.

The December 2006 Semi-Annual Report filed on behalf of this committee, covering the last half of 2006 lists the following contributions to candidates who appeared on the ballot at the November 2006 General Election.

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment

For Delinquently Filing a Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Election

This Committee received a contribution of \$1500 on 3/25/07, and listed it on a Schedule A-1 filed 4/26/07, 15 days late, resulting in a civil penalty of \$1500.

Terry D. Cornell, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Cornell stated that he had a fundraiser on March 25, 2007, and collected said check. He didn't have an account opened yet. When he did open a campaign account, it was after the 5-day reporting period.

This Committee was created 3/1/07. This contribution of \$1500 was received 3/25/07. I do not know what he was referring to in regards to a 5-day reporting period. According to Section 100.120(c) which reads in part: "A cash contribution to a political committee is deemed to have been received on the date the contribution was actually received by the candidate, Chairman or Treasurer of the committee or the public official..." This contribution was received as part of a fundraiser on March 25, 2007; therefore, it should have been reported on a Schedule A-1 within 2 business days from that date, whether or not an account had been opened. I therefore recommend that the appeal be denied. However, since there is no indication that the violation was anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, I also recommend that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment, or \$150. As a first violation, the penalty is stayed.

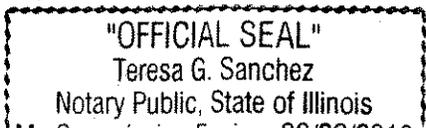

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment
For Delinquently Filing a D-1 Statement of Organization

This Report was received on 3/19/07, 13 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$325. In addition, the Committee had previously been assessed a \$200 civil penalty (not appealed) for delinquently filing a pre-election report for the 2007 Consolidated Election. The total assessment is \$525.

Rosemary Krieger, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Ms. Krieger stated that this was her first attempt at managing a campaign. Due to her job, she traveled and the forms came while she was out of town and could not file them, which she did at once when she returned to Chicago. This is a small committee, first time, and funds are not even available to cover at this time. She filed the 2007 June Semi-annual report timely and states that she will continue to do so in the future. She asks that this penalty be reversed as nothing was done with malice, just ignorance by a first-time campaign manager.

Despite the fact that there was no intent to file the D-1 delinquently, I must recommend that the appeal be denied. It is the responsibility of the Treasurer to know and understand the law and to be aware of the Committee's filing obligations. Failure to be aware of one's filing obligations is not a valid defense. Therefore, if this recommendation is accepted by the Board, the stay will be lifted from the previously assessed \$200, and the entire penalty of \$525 will be due and owing.

This D-1 Statement of Organization was received April 4, 2007, 7 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$175.

Marie Slater, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Ms. Slater stated that the D-1 Statement of Organization was signed and mailed 3/29/07 – 10 days after committee formation on 3/19/07 (8 working days). A copy was sent to DuPage Election Commission as well as the State Board of Elections. There was no opportunity to fax or e-mail. Therefore, U.S. Mail was the only means of forwarding documents and delivery was not expedient.

Section 5/9-3 of the Campaign Disclosure Act reads in part: "...every local political committee shall file with the State Board of Elections...a statement of organization within 10 business days of the creation of such committee, except any political committee created within the 30 days before an election shall file a statement of organization within 5 business days..." This committee was created on 3/19/07, within the 30 days prior to the election, and therefore, the D-1 should have been filed within 5 business days of the date of creation. The D-1 was not only not filed within the 5 business day window but, according to Ms. Slater's Affidavit, it was not even mailed until 8 business days after the date of creation. I therefore recommend that the appeal be denied. As a first violation, the penalty is stayed. Noting that the Committee filed a Final Report on May 11, 2007, I further recommend that during the two year period beginning with the Final Board Order, any successor committee be considered as never having violated the law, if it is assessed no other penalty.

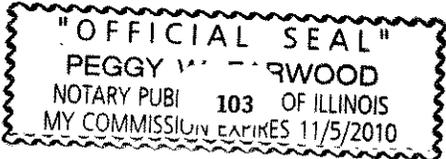

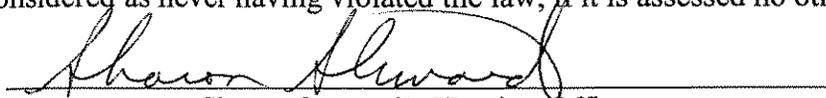

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment
For Delinquently Filing a D-1 Statement of Organization

The D-1 Statement of Organization was received on April 5, 2007, 3 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$75.

Robert Scheidt, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Scheidt stated that the Committee filed the D-1 form on April 1, 2007, after they reached the \$3000 threshold in donations on April 1, 2007. The date on the D-1 form was November 16, 2006, which was the date they organized and created the party name, "Citizen's Action Team". This date should have been April 1, 2007, when they reached the \$3000 threshold. The Committee filed an amended D-1 with the correct date of April 1, 2007, which was received in the Springfield office of the Board on June 7, 2007.

Board staff reviewed the Final Report filed by the Committee on June 7, 2007 and determined that the actual Date of Creation for this Committee was March 26, 2007, not April 1, 2007, as indicated on the amended D-1. Upon review, I concur with that assessment. The committee expended in excess of \$3000 as of March 26, 2007. Therefore, I recommend that the appeal be denied, as the Committee did not file its D-1 Statement of Organization within 5 business days of that date. The 5 business day deadline was in effect because this occurred within the 30 days prior to the election for which this Committee was formed to support candidates on the ballot. Section 5/9-3 of the Campaign Disclosure Act reads in part: "...every local political committee shall file...a statement of organization within 10 business days of the creation of such committee, except any political committee created within the 30 days before an election shall file a statement of organization within 5 business days..." As a first violation, the penalty is stayed. Noting that the Committee filed a Final Report on June 7, 2007, I further recommend that during the two year period beginning with the Final Board Order, any successor committee be considered as never having violated the law, if it is assessed no other penalty.

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Delinquently Filing a D-1 Statement of Organization and For Failing to File Schedule A-1s for the 2006 General Election

This Committee filed a D-1 Statement of Organization on 1/31/07, 52 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$1300. In addition, this Committee received three in-kind contributions, one on 11/2/06 from the DuPage County Central Committee valued at \$866.67; a second on 11/4/06 from Citizens to Elect Joe Vosicky valued at \$1018.50; and a third on 11/4/06 from Citizens to Elect Joe Vosicky valued at \$634.71. The total assessment is \$3819.88.

Carol B. Davis, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit Ms. Davis stated that they did everything humanly possible to file in good faith. A complaint had been filed against this Committee in January 2007 regarding failure to file. When they received the complaint they contacted the parties involved to try to determine what was and what was not an in-kind contribution. The DuPage Central Committee was skeptical that the group flyer in question constituted an in-kind contribution. The in-kind contributions from the Vosicky campaign were complicated by the fact that they really did not know what had been sent out. Nothing had been reviewed or approved by the Gonzales campaign and they just did not know what had been printed and distributed. They were under the impression that the newspapers were free papers with endorsements and were not aware they were being mailed out until they questioned the volunteers for the Vosicky campaign's Get-Out-the-Vote after receipt of the complaint.

According to Ms. Davis, they were finally able to get the notice from the Vosicky campaign on January 29, 2007. They got notice from the DuPage County Democrats on January 25, 2007. Ms. Davis states that she and Ms. Gonzalez are not attorneys and that both have spent much of their lives volunteering their time, money and energy to serve their communities.

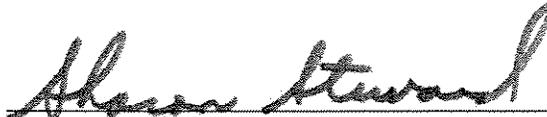
I spoke with Ms. Davis and with Ms. Gonzalez, the candidate, by phone on June 8, 2007, in an attempt to clarify the circumstances surround the receipt and notification of the in-kind contributions. The in-kind contribution from the DuPage County Central Committee was listed as having been received 11/2/06. This was a flyer that supported a total of 15 candidates, and the pro-rated value was \$866.67. Ms. Davis said she received the flyer in the mail on 11/2/06; therefore, on that date she would have known of the existence of the contribution, if not the actual value. A notification was given the Gonzalez Committee by the DuPage County Central Committee at a later date, on 1/25/07, but that notification came as a result of complaint against the committee for failure to file.

Therefore, according to Section 100.120(c), the date of receipt would have been 2 days later after Ms. Davis received the flyer in the mail, or 11/4/06.

The circumstances surrounding the in-kind contributions from Citizens to Elect Joe Vosicky were less clear cut. The Committee was aware that the candidate had been endorsed by the paper. Members of the Committee assisted with the distribution of a newspaper, but they are not totally sure whether or not that is the newspaper that was mailed, resulting in the in-kind contributions on 11/4/06 for printing and postage. There was friction between these two committees. Therefore, Gonzalez committee members knew something was being done on their candidate's behalf, but they did not know exactly what was being done or what the value was. On January 29, 2007, after numerous attempts to obtain information from the Vosicky committee, they received a fax with the value of the in-kind contribution. Again, this came as a result of the complaint filed in January 2007. According to Ms. Davis, the newspaper was mailed on 11/4/06. Therefore, the date of receipt would have been 2 days later, or 11/6/06.

In regards to the D-1 Statement of Organization, based upon cash received of \$2373.15 and \$3063.54 in in-kind contributions, the Date of Creation should have been on or about 11/2/06. Although there was confusion regarding these in-kind contributions, the candidate and/or committee members were aware at the time that these two organizations (the DuPage County Central Cmte and Citz to Elect Joe Vosicky) were making expenditures on behalf of the Rita Gonzalez campaign. Therefore, I recommend that the appeal be denied in regards to both the Schedule A-1s and the D-1 Statement of Organization.

However, since there is no indication that these violations were anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, I also recommend that the penalties for the Schedule A-1s be reduced to 10% of the original assessment or \$252. This amount of \$252 plus \$1300 for the delinquent filing of the D-1 total \$1552. In addition, noting that the report filed on June 4, 2007, was a Final Report, I further recommend that the fine be abated if the Committee remains dissolved for a period of 2 years following the date of the Final Board Order imposing the penalty.

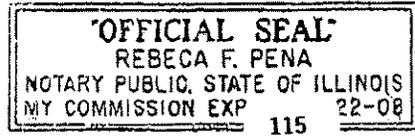

We did everything humanely possible to file in good faith as early as possible including hiring an attorney to assist us. We made mistakes but I believe we have more than paid for them in the nightmare that has ensued not to mention the burden of legal fees.

To the best of our knowledge until we received the complaint our campaign was well under the \$3,000 threshold required to file as a committee.

When we received the complaint we contacted the parties involved to try to determine its basis. The DuPage Central Committee was skeptical that the group flyer in question constituted an in-kind contribution. After consultation with a lawyer the flyer's status was verified, we advised the Central Committee and received the enclosed disclosure on January 25, 2005.

The in-kind contributions from the Vosicky campaign were complicated by the fact that we really did not know what had been sent out. Nothing had been reviewed or approved by us and we just did not know what had been printed and distributed. We were under the impression that the newspapers were free papers with endorsements and were not aware they were being mailed out until we questioned the volunteers for the Vosicky campaign's Get Out the Vote after the complaint was received.

By this time the election was long past and the Vosicky campaign had difficulty separating the general Get Out the Vote effort from the campaign's Hispanic drive which included the in-kinds for Rita. We received the enclosed disclosure on 1/29/07 after great effort and frustration on our part. Upon its receipt we filed within two days on January 31, 2007.

Upon advice of our attorney who reviewed the filing with us, we accepted responsibility for the in-kind contribution dated in November because although we were not aware they existed or constituted in-kind contributions in the lawyer's opinion we should have been aware of this.

I did not file Schedule A-1 reports because I did not know this was required. The filing had been approved by a lawyer who did not mention the need to report Schedule A1's. I had not thought it was not necessary due to the in-kind status of the qualifying donations and the late date of the filing. There was no attempt to deceive.

We simply could not file until we knew what to file. That required disclosures. Even when we realized there were in-kind contributions it took us far longer than 48 hours to determine what the contributions were and obtain the information necessary to disclose.

Rita and I are not lawyers. We are grandmothers who have spent much of our lives volunteering our time, money and energy to serve our communities. Our recent election efforts were my first attempt as a treasurer in a campaign and Rita's first attempt as a candidate (other than committeewomen) in over ten years. Neither of us have ever been

in violation of the Board of Elections, nor been responsible for a campaign that could remotely qualify as a political committee.

We ask that you stay our fines. If you require any documentation to substantiate our filing please advise us.

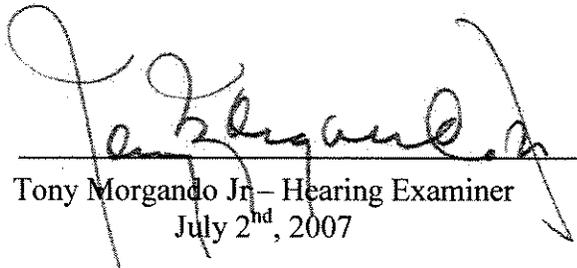
REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for the Failure to File a Statement of Organization during the requisite ten (10) day filing period. Such report was received on January 31st. 2007, 65 day(s) late, resulting in an assessed fine of \$1,625.00; failure to file in a timely fashion the Pre-Election Report for the November 7th, 2006 General Election, filed on January 31st, 2007, 11 day(s) late, resulting in an assessed fine of \$1,100.00, and the failure of the political committee to file required Schedule A-1 reports indicating receipt of contributions from the DuPage County Democratic Central Committee, dated 11/2/06, in the amount of \$866.67 and from the Citizens to Elect Joe Vosicky dated 11/4/07, in the amounts of \$1,018.50 and \$634.71. The political committee has been assessed a total civil penalty of \$5,244.88.

Mr. Robert Peickert, Candidate/Chairman/Treasurer, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on May 25th, 2007, prepared by Mr. Richard Means, counsel, indicating generally; (1) "the amounts assessed are excessive because Respondent's violations were inadvertent, unintentional and, at worst, negligent"; (2) "Respondent mistakenly believed that the United State Supreme Court ruling in Buckley v. Valeo made him exempt from the Illinois campaign finance reporting"; (3) "Respondent mistakenly believed that funds he spent on his own behalf and printing done by his solely-owned printing company did not need to be reported"; (4) Respondent Candidate did not know and understand that he was required to report expenditures as in-kind contributions"; (5) "after the closed preliminary hearing , the Respondent, through his attorney, filed an appearance and forthrightly admitted that the campaign expenditures controlled by Respondent's committee plus the expenditures made (and reported by) others did put his committee over the reporting threshold"; (6) that "on January 31, 2007 Respondent late filed a D-1 Statement of Organization and timely filed a D-2 Semi Annual Report of Campaign Contributions and Expenditures"; (7) "that the Respondent was in technical violation of failing to report 3 contributions in excess of \$500 in cash or value on forms A-1", and (8) Whatever amount the Board chooses to assess should have enforcement and collection stayed pending the Committee's compliance with Campaign Finance Act for a period of two years because all of the violations upon which assessments were made should be considered collectively as a first offense pursuant to Section 125.425(h) of the Boards Rules and Regulations. This case is factually similar to and therefore should be held to the same remedy as this Board applied to the civil penalty assessment appeals in State Board v. Chicagoland Apartment Association PAC, 06 MA 001 and State Board v. Black Legislative Lobby, 06 MA 002".

Hearing in this matter was initially set for Wednesday, June 13th, 2007, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 11:00 a.m. Mr. Peickert and the Hearing Examiner spoke telephonically on Wednesday, June 13th, 2007 and agreed to continue their discussion to Tuesday, June 19th, 2007. The political committee did file a Final Report on June 12th, 2007, terminating their campaign activity.

Based upon a review of the documents/statements submitted in this matter, and the filing of a Final Report, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that (a) the appeal be denied, (b) as a first time Schedule A-1 offense the original assessed penalty be reduced to 10% or \$252.00, and, (c) the assessed civil penalty of \$2,977.00 be abated if the Committee remains dissolved for a period of two (2) years following the date of the Final Order of the Board imposing the penalty.

The committee is fined a **total** of \$2519.88 for delinquently filing Schedule A-1 reports as required by the Illinois Campaign Disclosure Act. This total **does not** reflect any previously assessed fines.

Based upon this committee's failure to comply with the provision of 10 ILCS 5/9-10(b-5) of the Election Code, the Board may impose fines for violations not to exceed 100% of the total amount of the contributions that were untimely reported, but in no case when a fine is imposed shall it be less than 10% of the total amount of the contributions that were untimely reported.

Since this is the first delinquent Schedule A-1 filing by your committee, the civil penalty will be automatically reduced to \$252.00, (10% of the total amount reflected above) if you do not choose to file an appeal under the Board's present policy. The total amount due will be imposed with the issuance of a Final Board Order after the 30-day appeal period had expired. This amount must be paid (including any previously assessed fines), within 30 days of the issuance of the Order.

Enclosed please find Section 10 ILCS 5/9-3 of the Election Code and the forms with which you may appeal the assessed fine if you believe the civil penalty has been assessed in error. Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days of the mailing of this assessment notice. If you fail to file a Notice of Appeal within this 30 day period, you forfeit the right to contest this assessment.

**CIVIL PENALTY ASSESSMENT APPEAL "AFFIDAVIT" PURSUANT TO
SECTION 1-109 OF THE ILLINOIS CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE**

Pursuant to Section 125.425 (f) of the Board's Rules and Regulations, Respondent Bob Peickert, Chairman and Treasurer of Citizens to Elect Bob Peickert, by and through his attorney, Richard K. Means, hereby certifies that the said committee can offer a good reason or defense to the assessment of a civil penalty in this matter, and that such reasons and defenses are:

1. The amounts assessed are excessive because Respondent's violations were inadvertent, unintentional and, at worst, negligent. Specifically:
 - a. that until the filing of the complaint that brought the Respondent's violations to his attention and this Board's attention, Respondent was a without legal counsel,
 - b. that, prior to the complaint case being filed, Respondent mistakenly believed that the United States Supreme Court ruling in *Buckley v. Valeo* [424 U.S. 1, 96 S. Ct. 612 (1976)] made him exempt from Illinois campaign finance reporting because he did not intend to accept campaign contributions from others in excess of \$3000 but intended his campaign for office to be primarily self-financed. Instead, of course, *Buckley* applies only to candidates for federal office and then only makes them exempt from federal contribution limitations, to the extent that they are self-funded, and does not exempt them from campaign finance reporting,
 - c. that, prior to the complaint case being filed, Respondent mistakenly believed that funds he spent on his own behalf and printing done by his solely-owned printing company did not need to be reported as contributions or expenditures made on behalf of his candidacy,
 - d. the Respondent Candidate, himself, did not take contributions (other than from himself or his solely owned printing company) in excess of \$2595.00 or make expenditures (other than from himself or to his solely owned printing company) in excess of \$2822.63 during the entire semi-annual period. Additionally, the Respondent Candidate did not know and understand that he was required to report expenditures as in-kind contributions (and

consider them in computing whether and when he reached the reporting threshold) which were made by and reported by other reporting committees but redounded to his benefit. In other words, his lapse was inadvertent, unintentional and, at worst, negligent,

- e. after receiving the complaint and being advised by his newly-hired counsel, the Respondent Candidate came to understand that he had the legal obligation to report both his own expenditures and also to report (as in-kind contributions) if he received the benefit of expenditures made by other political committees and reported by them,
 - f. after the closed preliminary hearing in the complaint case, the Respondent, through his attorney, filed an appearance and forthrightly admitted that the campaign expenditures controlled by Respondent's committee *plus* the expenditures made (and reported by) others did put his committee over the reporting threshold before the Election Day and, therefore, he would late file a D-1 Statement of Organization and timely file a D-2 Semi-Annual Report of Contributions and Expenditures with the State Board and with the DuPage County Clerk on or before January 31, 2007,
 - g. on January 31, 2007, Respondent late filed a D-1 Statement of Organization and timely filed a D-2 Semi-Annual Report of Contributions and Expenditures (and amended D-2) with the State Board and with the DuPage County Clerk,
 - h. that the primary purpose of campaign finance reporting is to inform the electorate of the persons or entities to whom a candidate may be obligated for the funding with which a campaign is financed. It is no revelation or surprise to voters that a candidate supports himself and therefore, the failure of a candidate to disclose his self-funding is not a substantial violation of the Campaign Finance Act though it is a technical violation,
 - i. the D-1 and amended D-2 show that the Respondent *was in technical violation* of failing to report the formation of a campaign finance committee within 5 business days after the expenditures he made (and those imputed to him for in-kind spending by others) crossed the \$3000 reporting threshold on October 10, 2006. That deadline came and went on October 17, 2006, however therefore no voter was deprived of any knowledge which should have been available to them under the Campaign Finance Act, *other than that the candidate was self-funded and that other reporting committees had made expenditures redounding to his benefit*, to better inform their voting because of the Respondent's tardiness in reporting, and
 - j. the D-1 and D-2 show that the Respondent *was in technical violation* of failing to report 3 contributions in excess of \$500 in cash or value on forms A-1 to the extent that campaign spending was made by already reporting committees which should have been reported as in-kind contributions prior to the November 7, 2007 Election Day.
2. Whatever amount the Board chooses to assess should have enforcement and collection stayed pending the Committee's compliance with the Campaign Finance Act for a period of two years because all of the violations upon which assessments were made should be considered collectively as a first offense pursuant to Section 125.425 (h) of the Board's Rules and Regulations. This case is factually similar to and therefore should be held to the same remedy as this Board applied to the civil penalty assessment appeals in *State Board v. Chicagoland Apartment Association PAC*, 06 MA 001 and *State Board v. Black Legislative Lobby*, 06 MA 002, both of which were decided by this Board on June 12, 2006.

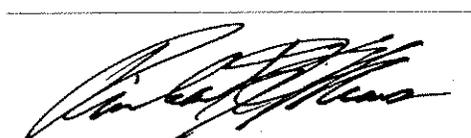

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for the Late Filing of a
Schedule A-1 for the 2006 General Election

According to the political committee's Schedule A-1 reports, filed February 5th, 2007, it received 2 contributions from the SEIU Local 880 PAC, one dated 1/30/07, in the amount of \$2,119.63 (2 days late), and the other dated 2/5/07, in the amount of \$5,000 (1 day late). A subsequent A-1 report was filed on February 26th, 2007, indicating receipt of a contribution in the amount of \$53,734.14, dated 2/5/07, 11 days late. The political committee has been fined a total of \$60,853.77 for delinquent filing Schedule A-1 reports.

Ms. JoAnn Thompson, Candidate/Chairman, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on May 29th, 2007, indicating: "The A-1 reported on 2/26/07 was information which did not come into the possession of Candidate (who filed all A-1 reports) until February 26, 2007. The pattern of timely filings of other A-1's supports this conclusion, and will be shown at the hearing. The other alleged violations were due to "beginner's misunderstandings".

Hearing in this matter was set for Wednesday, June 13th 2007, rescheduled to Friday, June 22nd, 2007, by request of counsel, Mr. Michael Kreloff, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 9:00 a.m.

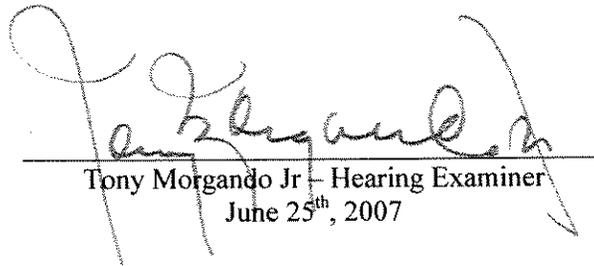
Ms. Joann Thompson, Candidate/Chairman, Mr. Michael Krelof, counsel, appeared on behalf of the Respondent. Mr. Krelof indicated that during the month of February, 2007, the political committee filed approximately seven (7) Schedule A-1's, containing 66 entries of which 61 represented in-kind contributions. These in-kind contributions were brought to the attention of Ms. Thompson via In-Kind Notification forms faxed to the candidate. Once Ms. Thompson was aware of a faxed In-Kind Contribution Notification form, she commuted to the Chicago Board office and sought assistance in filing from Disclosure staff. Ms. Thompson stated in relation to the SEIU Local 880 PAC contributions reported as received January 30th & 31st, 2007, actual awareness of such contributions was not until Thursday, February 1st, 2007. Ms. Thompson provided copies of In-Kind Contribution Notification forms, indicating faxed receipt on January 29th and January 30th respectively. In relation to the SEIU Illinois Council PAC in-kind contribution, in the amount of \$53,734.14, reported received on February 5th, 2007, submitted on a Schedule A-1 on February 26th, eleven (11) days late, Ms. Thompson stated such faxed In-Kind Contribution Notification form apparently was mixed among campaign papers.

Ms. Thompson indicated once she was aware of the In-Kind Contribution Notification form, she immediately sought assistance from the Disclosure staff. Ms. Thompson submitted a copy of the faxed In-Kind Contribution Notification form, indicating a transmittal date of February 5th, 2007.

The Hearing Examiner spoke with Andy Nauman, Staff Specialist, who indicated Ms. Thompson appeared at the Chicago office seeking assistance in filing disclosure documents, Schedule A-1's included. Mr. Nauman stated the political committee filed 20+ Schedule A-1's, containing approximately 145 entries, which 128 were based on In-Kind Contribution Notification forms faxed to the political committee.

If Ms. Thompson became aware of the SEIU Local 880 PAC in-kind contributions on Thursday, February 1st, 2007, which nothing appears to contradict, the political committee's Schedule A-1 received on Monday, February 5th, 2007, was filed within the 48-hour requirement provided in statute. Regardless, the in-kind contribution "shall be deemed to be received 2 days after the date the certification" was presented to the political committee, R&R 100.120(c). Therefore, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be **GRANTED** in regards to the two contributions totaling \$7119.63 from the SEIU Local 880 PAC.

In relation to the SEIU Illinois Council PAC in-kind contribution, the Hearing Examiner notes that during the February 5th, 2007 In-Kind Contribution Notification transmittal date and the actual February 25th, 2007, Schedule A-1 filing, the political committee filed nine (9) Schedule A-1's, containing 47 entries. It is difficult for the Hearing Examiner to believe the delay was caused by a lack of awareness, considering the number of faxes the political committee apparently reported on Schedule A-1's in a timely fashion. Therefore it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be **DENIED** in regard to the \$53,734.14 contribution from the SEIU Illinois Council PAC, and that amount of the fine be reduced by 10% to \$5374.00 and **STAYED** as a first violation.

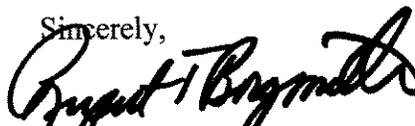

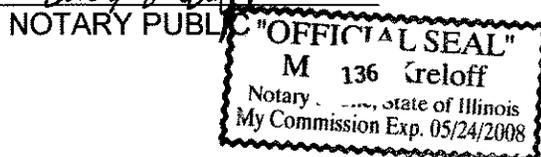

REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for the Late Filing of a
Schedule A-1 for the 2006 General Election

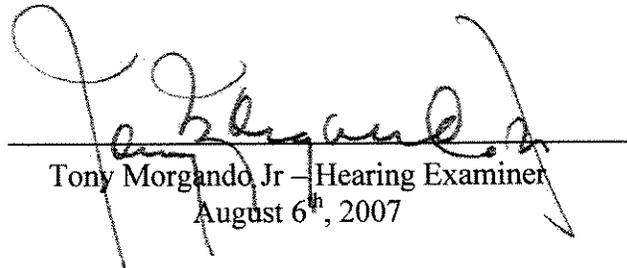
According to the two (2) Schedule A-1's filed by the political committee, one dated February 7th, 2007, disclosing receipt of five (5) contributions from the SEIU IL Council PAC, totaling \$4,847.95, dated February 2nd, 2007, was 1 day late. The other Schedule A-1 dated February 24th, 2007, disclosed two (2) contributions from the SEIU IL Council PAC, totaling \$3,550.00, dated February 21st, 2007, was 1 day late. The political committee has been fined a total of \$8,397.95 for delinquent filing Schedule A-1 reports.

Ms. Carina Sanchez, Candidate/Chairman, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on May 31st, 2007, indicating "The committee filed the A-1's within the required 2 business days of receipt. A-1's were faxed and received at the office after the date listed on the contribution form".

Hearing in this matter was originally set for Monday, June 25th, 2007, continued through agreement of the parties to Thursday, July 19th, 2007 to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 12-noon. The political committee did file a Final Report on Tuesday, July 31st, 2007, terminating its campaign activity.

Ms. Carina Sanchez appeared on behalf of the political committee. Ms. Sanchez presented four (4) In-Kind Contribution Notification forms, faxed to the political committee from the SEIU IL Council PAC, which indicated (a) in-kind contributions originally reported received on 2/20/07 (\$1,750.00) and 2/21/07 (\$1,800.00), were actually faxed to the political committee on 2/22/07, and, (b) in-kind contributions originally reported received on 2/2/07 (\$1,800.00 & \$694.70), were actually faxed to the political committee on 2/5/07. Ms. Sanchez was able to produce In-Kind Contribution Notification forms for the remaining questionable Schedule A-1's, but these lacked indication of the date and time such notices were faxed to the political committee.

Based upon a review of the documents/statements submitted, it is apparent the political committee did report four (4) in-contributions totaling \$6,044.70 within the two (2) business day requirement established by statute. Without a fax transmission date attached to the three (3) In-kind Contribution Notification forms, totaling \$2,353.25, the Hearing Examiner is unable to determine actual receipt by the political committee. Therefore, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that (a) the appeal be granted in relation to the four (4) in-kind contributions totaling \$6,044.70, (b) the appeal be denied in relation to the three (3) in-kind contributions totaling \$2,353.25, (c) as a first time Schedule A-1 offense the original assessed penalty be reduced to 10% or \$236.00, and (d) the assessed civil penalty of \$236.00 be abated if the political committee remains dissolved for a period of two (2) years following the date of the Final Order of the Board imposing the penalty.

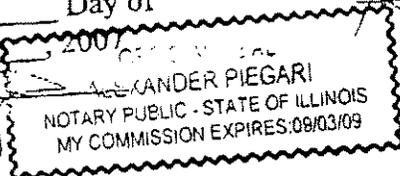

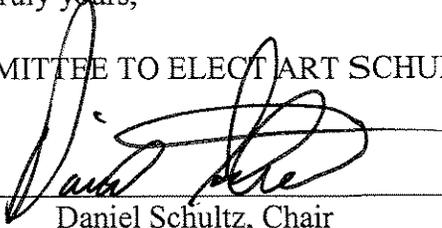
This Committee wants the State Board of Elections to know the short delay in filing was certainly not intentional and at worst, was simply an oversight.

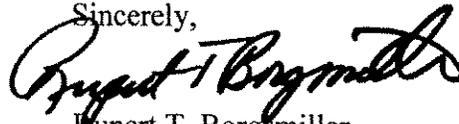

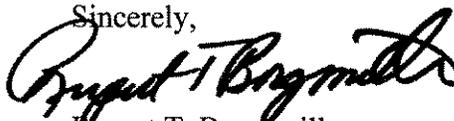
Based upon this committee's failure to comply with the provision of 10 ILCS 5/9-10(b-5) of the Election Code, the Board may impose fines for violations not to exceed 100% of the total amount of the contributions that were untimely reported, but in no case when a fine is imposed shall it be less than 10% of the total amount of the contributions that were untimely reported.

Since this is the first delinquent Schedule A-1 filing by your committee, the civil penalty will be automatically reduced to \$1225.00, (10% of the total amount reflected above) if you do not choose to file an appeal under the Board's present policy. The total amount due will be imposed with the issuance of a Final Board Order after the 30-day appeal period had expired. This amount must be paid (including any previously assessed fines), within 30 days of the issuance of the Order.

Enclosed please find Section 125.425 Civil Penalty Assessments and the forms with which you may appeal the assessed fines if you believe the civil penalties have been assessed in error. ***If you have a legitimate reason for your delinquent filing, it would behoove you to send in the appeal form since the Board has the discretion to take extenuating and other circumstances into account in determining the amount of your penalty.*** Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days of the mailing of this assessment for it to be considered.

Thus, around 250 committees received the amnesty letter that was sent out on August 8, 2007. Procedural History

On May 18, 2007, the above referenced Complainant filed a Form D-4 Complaint for violation of the Campaign Disclosure Act, wherein it is specifically alleged that pursuant to 10 ILCS 5/9-13, and 5/9-14 of the Campaign Disclosure Act, the Respondent failed to file a Semi Annual Report for the period specified above.

On June 21, 2007, a Closed Preliminary Hearing was convened in the Chicago Offices of the State Board of Elections. At that time, the Respondent failed to appear at said hearing, nor had the report in question been filed, and as a result, the Hearing Examiner determined that the Complaint had been filed on justifiable grounds, and recommended that a Public Hearing be conducted. On July 3, 2007, the Board issued an Order for a Public Hearing to be held on July 25, 2007.

On July 25, 2007, 10:30 AM, after recognizing that Proof of Service upon the Respondent had been obtained, a Public Hearing was convened. At the Public Hearing, in attendance on behalf of the Complainant was Tony Morgando, Deputy Director of the Division of Campaign Disclosure, and Disclosure Specialist, Tara Cachur.

Ms. Cachur testified on behalf of the Complainant. She tendered the following exhibits and requested that they be admitted into evidence on behalf of the Complainant: (1) A D-1, Statement of Organization, and (2) a Semi Annual Report for the period of January through June 2006.

CONCULSSIONS AND RECCOMENDATIONS

Proof of Service upon the Respondent had been obtained. The exhibits indicate that the Respondent was in fact a Committee and that the Semi Annual Report for the prior reporting period indicated that there was a balance of \$816.30 remaining at the close of that reporting period. Therefore, given the fact that the Respondent failed to appear at the Public Hearing, or file the report the for the period at issue, it is my recommendation that the Board issue an Order directing the Respondent to file said report within 30 days of the date of it's Order.

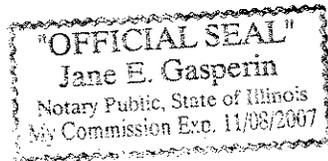

Date: July 26, 2007

Pursuant to 10 ILCS 5/25-3(4), the State Board of Elections is charged with the responsibility of determining whether the General Assembly has created additional judgeships. This determination must be made no later than 100 days prior to the General Primary Election. That deadline falls on October 28, 2007. Public Acts 93-1040 and 94-0727 created three additional judgeships in the 12th Judicial Circuit (Will County) and allocated them to the 2nd, 3rd and 4th sub-circuits within the 12th Circuit. These additional judgeships are to be filled at the 2008 General Election.

Enclosed is a listing of these new judgeships that was sent to the State Board of Elections from the Office of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. I am requesting the Board to officially declare these three additional judgeships designating them as "Additional Judgeship A, B and C", to be allocated to the 2nd, 3rd and 4th sub-circuits respectively.
